Power Company, a Maine Corporation qualified to do business and  
doing business in the State of Utah, with its principal place of  
business in said State at Salt Lake City, Grantee, for the sum of  
\$46,162 to know,) <sup>not to sign?</sup>  
designed to make a part of the main line of the company's  
power line from the Colorado River to Salt Lake City, in consideration  
whereof the Grantor does hereby convey and warrant to the  
Grantee all the right, title and interest he now has in and to the  
following described tract of land in Salt Lake County, State of Utah, to-wit:

Beginning at a point 2412 feet south of the N.E. corner of section 11,  
running due west 1200 feet, and running thence 15.41° 25' W. a distance of  
800 feet, more or less, to the west line of the east half of said
