The United States of America:

Certificate To all whom these presents shall come Greeting:

No 3798 I, Joseph Turpen of Salt Lake County, Utah Territory, have deposited, in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Joseph Turpen according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2d of April 1850, entitled An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands; and the acts supplemental thereto, for the East half of the Northwest quarter, and the West half of the Northeast quarter of Section Fourteen, in Township three South of Range two West of Salt Lake Meridian, in Utah Territory, containing One Hundred and Sixty Acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Joseph Turpen.

I do now grant that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Joseph Turpen and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To Have and To Hold, the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, therunto belonging unto the said Joseph Turpen and to his heirs and assigns forever, subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his or therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law, and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

In Testimony Whereof I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the Sixteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Ninety two, and of the Independence of the United States, the One hundred and Sixteenth.
