#### HOLLADAY CITIZEN RESPONSE SHEET

#### NOTE:

On September 23, 1985, the Granite School District Board of Education met to review a report on the closing of one of three junior highs in the Eastern portion of Salt Lake County: Olympus Junior High, Wasatch Junior High and Churchill Junior High. The report reviewed a number of aspects of the schools including things like curriculum, enrollment, building characteristics, etc. While the board indicated that it had not yet decided which school they are going to close, the comments of the staff and the way the report has been written strongly suggest that Olympus Junior High is the one that is most likely for closure. One of the main reasons for this is an appraisal that suggests that the property can be sold for commercial use. The appraiser implies in his report that even though the current zoning is R-1-10 (a single dwelling home on 10,000 sq. feet), which is a higher zoning than the other two junior high sites, it is very likely that the property can be rezoned to an R-M (use for high density multiple residential or office buildings). This would represent a significant down zoning of several levels and does not seem to take into account the fact that a majority of the property around the building is residential. For that reason, we think that it is important that we communicate with the County Planning and Zoning and the County Commission that we do not want our residential areas impacted even more than they currently are with unreasonable and out-of-scale commercial developments. To that end, we would like you to review the statement below and voluntarily endorse it. We will transmit it to the Planning and Zoning Committee and County Commission.

### TO PLANNING AND ZONING STAFF MEMBER OR COUNTY COMMISSIONER:

This is to advise you that I , the undersigned, a citizen and homeowner within 300 feet of Olympus Junior High School strongly request that you do not down zone the property of Olympus Junior High School, should the Granite School Distrist choose to close it, from the R-1-10 of it's current zoning. I further urge you to not create any variance, strip or incompatible usage to the residential character of the homes surrounding the current zoning.

If an R-M downzone is granted or if usage incompatible with the current neighborhood is approved, it will represent further commercial encroachment onto the residential character of the area and will create significant traffic and usage problems for the nearby residents.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

At the request of Superintendent John Reed Call, the Planning Commission staff reviewed the three junior high schools presently being studied for possible closure. The Planning Commission neither supports or opposes closure of any particular school, feeling that the decision must be based on a broad range of factors many of which are beyond the scope of Planning Commission concerns. However, we agreed with our staff's analysis of each of the schools related to: 1) its present attractiveness as a school site, and 2) future reuse in the event it is closed.

The Planning Commission feels strongly that if Olympus Jr. High school is closed, the present athletic field, consisting of approximately 4 acres, should be preserved as permanent open space for passive and active recreation in the Holladay Community. This playground is very visible from 4800 South and Hugo Avenue, has a long history of public use for recreation and is a focal point for the Holladay Community. Therefore, retreation are commission will resist changing the zoning or the use of the property to other than a public recreation area. Use of the existing buildings, or new building in the event the existing are replaced, must be compatible with the single family neighborhood to the north. Potential purchasers should be made aware of these restrictions early.

We are stating our position at this time so it can be taken into consideration in determining the value of the site for reuse.
