GRANT OF RIGHT OF WAY

Know All Men By These Presents:

That Arthur J. Wheelright and Elsie K. Wheelright, husband and wife, of Woods Cross, Utah, hereinafter called the grantors, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar and other good and valuable considerations to them in hand paid by the grantee hereinafter mentioned, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto Louis M. Staim, of Salt Lake City, Utah, hereinafter called the grantee, a perpetual easement and right of way for the erection and continual maintenance of an electrical power or telephone line, consisting of necessary poles and wires, the same to connect onto the terminus of the present line of grantors, extending from the main highway West near the South line of grantors' land, and to extend over, upon and across the south side of the following described tract of land in Davis County, Utah, to-wit:

Commencing on the west side of Highway at a point South 89° 53' West 407.2 feet and South 42' East 1010.75 feet, and South 22° 37' West 577.8 feet from the Northeast Corner of Section 11, Township 1 North, Range 1 West, Salt Lake Meridian, United States Survey, and running thence along said Highway, South 22° 37' West 413.5 feet; thence West 575 feet to the right of way of the Bamberger Electric Railroad; thence North 23° East 415 feet; thence East 571.8 feet to the point of commencement, containing 5.00 acres.
