To All To Whom These Presents Shall Come, Greeting:

Whereas, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vernal, Utah, has been deposited in the General Land Office, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the claimant Tanner B. Singleton

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of April 24, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the public Lands"; and the acts supplemental thereto, for the northeast quarter and the east half of the northwest quarter of Section twenty-eight in Township Four south of Range ten west of the Uinta Special Meridian, Utah, containing two hundred forty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor-General:
