 cisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby
 granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals construct-
 ed by the authority of the United States. Also excepting and reser-
 ving to the United States all oil and gas and all shale or other
 rock valuable as a source of petroleum and nitrogen in the
 lands so patented, and to it, or persons authorized by it, the right
 to prospect for, mine, and remove such deposits from the
 same upon compliance with the conditions and subject
 to the provisions and limitations of the Act of July 17, 1914.
 (38 Stat., 509).

Now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, has given and granted, and by these presents does give and grant unto the said claimant and to the heirs of the said claimant the tract above described; To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, there unto belonging, unto the said claimant and to the heirs and assigns of the said claimant forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches and canals constructed by the authority of the United States. Also reserving and reserving to the United States all oil and gas and all shale and other rock valuable as a source of petroleum and nitrogen in the lands so granted, and to it, or persons authorized by it, the right to prospect for, mine, and remove such deposits from the same upon compliance with the conditions and subject to the provisions and limitations of the Act of July 17, 1914.
