Also excepting and reserving to the United States all oil and gas and all shale or other rock valuable as a source of petroleum and nitrogen on the lands so patented, and to it, or persons authorized by it, the right to prospect for, mine, and remove such deposits from the same upon compliance with the conditions and subject to the provisions and limitations of the Act of July 17, 1914 (38 Stat. 509).
