WARRANTY DEED.

George Openshaw and Emeline Openshaw his wife, Walter Dummer and Esther E. Dummer his wife grantor S. of Paysonville, County of Davis State of Utah hereby CONVEY AND WARRANT to Paysonville City, a Municipal Corporation of the State of Utah grantee of the same place for the sum of Two hundred and eighty (280.00) DOLLARS, the following described tract...of land in Davis County, State of Utah:

Beginning at a point 401.9 feet East of the Southwest corner of Section 25 in Township 4 North, Range 1 West, Salt Lake Meridian, U. S. Survey, and running thence East 905.5 feet, thence N 70° 18' E. 1820 feet, thence S 83° 40' W. 341.5 feet, thence S 51° 31' W. 937.7 feet, thence S. 12° 50' E. 871 feet, thence S. 6° 05' W. 347 feet to the place of beginning, containing 35.5 acres, more or less.

Together with all the Springs and subterranean waters having their rise on, or being upon, or in said tract of land, excepting such springs having their rise in the reservoir pit hereinafter reserved, and such other springs as now or heretofore have had their rise in the bottom of the North Fork of the hollow above said reservoir in site, provided said grantors shall not develop said springs but can use them only in their natural condition, as heretofore used.

The said grantor specifically reserve the right to maintain a reservoir about six rods East of the Mountain Road with earthen dam without any retaining wall, not exceeding ten feet in height, to be tapped at the bottom of said earthen dam, and also use the bottom of the hollow and ditches in the same manner heretofore used by them but not to, in any way, interfere with the underflow in said hollow.

Beginning at the Southwest corner of section 25 in township 4 North, Range 1 West, Salt Lake Meridian, U. S. Survey, and running thence East 342.1 feet, thence N. 6° 56' E. 318.3 feet, thence N. 12° 12' W. 400.4 feet, thence N. 11° 54' W. 191.6 feet, thence S. 67° 05' W. 173.2 feet, thence S. 52° 16' W. 310.8 feet, thence S. 42° 13' W. 349.5 feet, thence S. 24° 50' W. 373.6 feet, thence S. 32° 17' W. 48.3 feet, thence S. 57° 44' E. 201.3 feet, thence N. 51° 59' E. 77 feet, thence S. 80° 09' E. 152.4 feet, thence N. 56° 07' E. 258.8 feet, thence S. 85° 42' E. 47.3 feet to the place of beginning containing 14.50 Acres more or less.

The grantors specifically reserve the right to the use of sufficient water from said Springs, and a right of way to convey the same, for culinary and domestic purposes for two houses, to be conveyed in an inch pipe, and not exceeding four gallons per minute.
