Patent No 26. The United States of America.

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, by the act of Congress approved July 1, 1862 July 2, 1864  
July 3, 1866, joint-resolution of July 26, 1866 and April 10, 1869, and the act  
of May 6, 1870 "to aid in the construction of a railroad and telegraph line  
from the Missouri River to the Pacific Ocean and to secure to Govern-  
ment the use of the same for Postal Military and other purposes" Authority  
is given to the Union Pacific Rail Road Company to construct a railroad  
and telegraph line" under certain conditions and stipulations as expressed  
in said acts; and provision is made for granting to the said Company  
every alternate section of Public Land designated by odd numbers to the  
amount of ten alternate sections per mile on each side of the said Rail  
road, on the line thereof, and within the limits of twenty miles on each side  
of said road" not sold, reserved, or otherwise disposed of by the United  
States, and to which a Pre-emption or Homestead Claim may not have  
attached at the time the line of said road is definitely fixed.

And whereas an Official Statement bearing date August 1st 1869

from the Secretary of the Interior has been filed in the General Land Office, showing that the Commission appointed by the President, under provisions of the sixth section of the said act of Congress approved July 2, 1864. Have reported to him that the line of railroad and telegraph from Omaha in the State of Nebraska westward to Ogden, in the Territory of Utah and known as the Union Pacific Rail Road, has been constructed and is in completed and equipped in the manner described by the acts of Congress, relative to the Pacific Railroad and Telegraph Line; and the Union Pacific Railroad Company, formerly the Union Pacific Railroad Company has applied for a conveyance of the title to the lands granted to said Company by said act of Congress of July 1, 1862 and July 2, 1864.

And whereas certain tracts have been selected under the acts aforesaid, by Leavitt Burnham, the duly authorized land agent of the Union Pacific Railroad Company formerly the Union Pacific Railroad Company as shown by his detailed list of selections dated May 24, 1881 returned under date of May 27, 1881, by the Register and Receiver at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory. The said tracts of land lie contiguous to the constructed line of road and are particularly described as follows to-wit:

North of base line and West of Salt Lake Principal Meridian Utah Territory  
Township One, Range One

The North East Quarter of the North East Quarter of Section One, containing forty acres, the North West Quarter of the North West Quarter, the West half of the South West Quarter and the South East Quarter of the South West Quarter of Section Two, containing One Hundred and sixty acres.

Township Two Range One

The North East Quarter of the South East Quarter of Section One, containing forty acres. The North West Quarter of Section Twelve, containing One Hundred and sixty acres. The West half of Section twenty seven, containing three hundred and twenty acres.

Township Three Range One

The South East Quarter of the South West Quarter of Section twenty five, containing forty acres.

Township Five, Range One.

The North West Quarter of the South East Quarter, and the North West Quarter of the South West Quarter of Section fifteen. Containing eighty acres, The North West Quarter of the South West Quarter of Section twenty three containing forty acres, The South West Quarter of the South East Quarter of Section nineteen containing forty acres, The South East Quarter of Section thirty nine containing One hundred and
