Richards, Judge as aforesaid, in trust as aforesaid, and to his successors the said Tract above described; To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, therunto belonging, unto the said Franklin S. Richards, Judge as aforesaid, in trust as aforesaid, and to his successors and assigns in trust as aforesaid. No title shall be hereby acquired to any mine of gold, silver, cinnabar or copper, or to any valid mining claim or possession held under existing laws of Congress. Wm. C. Johnson Secretary of the United States of America, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
