U.S. of America to John H. Green.

The United States of America, To all to whom these presents shall come greeting: Whereas, in pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, entitled "An Act donating Public Lands to the several States and Territories which may provide Colleges for the benefit of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts," there has been deposited in the General Land Office Scrip No. 468 for one quarter section of Land, in favor of the State of Mississippi, duly assigned by the proper authority of the said State to John H. Green.

The North West quarter of Section twenty-eight in Township four North of Range one West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Salt Lake City Utah Territory, containing One hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now know ye, that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said John H. Green as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John H. Green as assignee as aforesaid and his heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water right for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and the right to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.
