To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Certificate } Whereas Louis Tan Mayor of the city of Ogden, Nevada County, Utah Territory in trust
 No. 289 } for the several use and benefit of the occupants of said city of Ogden according to
 their respective interests by virtue of an act of Congress approved March 2^d 1867 entitled "An
 act for the relief of the inhabitants of cities and towns upon the public lands" has deposited
 in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office
 at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory whereby it appears that full payment has been made by
 the said Louis Tan Mayor as aforesaid, in trust as aforesaid, according to the provisions of
 the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for
 the sale of the Public lands," for the South East quarter of Section twenty, the South West quar-
ter of Section Twenty One, the West half, the West half of the South East quarter, and the West
half of the North East quarter of Section twenty eight, Section twenty nine, Section thirty
two, the North west quarter, the North half of the South West quarter, the West half of the
North East quarter, and the West half of the South East quarter of Section thirty three, in
 Township six North of Range one West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Salt
 Lake City, Utah Territory, containing six thousand four hundred and eighty acres,
 according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land
 Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Louis
 Tan Mayor as aforesaid, in trust as aforesaid,

Now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in con-
 formity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and
 granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Louis Tan Mayor, as
 aforesaid, in trust as aforesaid, and to his successors, the said tract above described;

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and
 appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Louis Tan Mayor
 or as aforesaid, ^{In trust as aforesaid} and to his successors and assigns, in trust as aforesaid. No title shall
 be lawfully acquired to any mine of gold silver, copper or to any valid mining
 claim or possession held under existing laws of Congress.

In Testimony Whereof I Ulysses S. Grant President of the United States of America have
 caused these Letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be
