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PROTECTIVE COVENANTS

for

RAYMOND SHUPE ADDITION TO THE TOWN OF SUNSET,
COUNTY OF DAVIS, STATE OF UTAH

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

These covenants are to run with the land and shall be binding on all parties and all persons claiming under them until January 1, 1973, at which time said covenants shall be automatically extended for successive periods of ten years unless by vote of a majority of the then owners of the lots it is agreed to change said covenants in whole or in part.

If the parties hereto, or any of them, or their heirs or assigns, shall violate or attempt to violate any of the covenants herein it shall be lawful for any person or persons owning any real property situated in said development or subdivision to prosecute any proceedings at law or in equity against the person or persons violating or attempting to violate any such Covenant and wither to prevent him or them from so doing or to recover damages or other dues for such violation.

Invalidation of any one of these covenants by judgment or court order shall in no wise affect any of the other provisions which shall remain in full force and effect.

A. All lots in the tract shall be known and described as residential lots. No structure shall be erected, altered, placed, or permitted to remain on any residential building plot other than one detached single-family dwelling not to exceed two stories in height and a private garage for not more than two cars.

B. No building shall be erected, placed, or altered on any building plot in this subdivision until the building-plans, specifications, and plot plan showing the location of such building have been approved in writing as to conformity and harmony of external design with existing structures in the subdivision, and as to location of the building with respect to topography and finished ground elevation, by a committee composed of RAYMOND SHUPE JR. GUINEVERE SHUPE and A. R. SHUPE, or by representative designated by a majority of the members of said committee. In the event of death or resignation of any member of said Committee, the remaining member, or members, shall have full authority to approve or disapprove such design and location, or to designate a representative with like authority. In the event said committee or its designated representative, fails to approve or
