Contract

This Agreement of Salt Lake City, a municipal corporation, Edward Laird and Smart Land and Improvement Company, one with the others,

Witnesseth: Whereas, said City is conveying to each of the other parties herein certain portions of the right of way of Jordan and Salt Lake City Canal in exchange for certain other lands which are to be used for street purposes; and

Whereas, all parties hereto are anxious that the waters of said canal be placed in a concrete conduit where it passes through said lands conveyed to said Laird and to Smart Land and Improvement Company,

Now, therefore, as part and parcel of said entire transaction and upon the considerations herein manifest, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto,

1. Smart Land and Improvement Company agrees that it will, at its own expense, within one year from date hereof, construct, according to plans and specifications to be prepared by City Engineer, a concrete conduit for the waters of said canal, extending from present conduit at its end on south line of Twelfth South Street along bed of present canal southward 119.14 feet.

2. Edward Laird and Smart Land and Improvement Company agree that they will construct, at their own expense, according to plans and specifications to be prepared by City Engineer, a concrete conduit for the waters of said canal along bed of present canal from a point 200 feet north of the north side of Twelfth South Street, northward to north line of lot 19, Block 4, 5-acre Plat A, Big Tujah Survey.

3. Said City agrees within one year to build conduit from north side of Twelfth South Street northward along present bed of canal for a distance of 200 feet.

4. Said City also agrees to pay to said Laird and said Smart Land and Improvement Company the sum of one hundred forty-five (\$145.00) dollars to pay them for removing buildings, structures, fences, debris from Twelfth South Street now on lands they are conveying to said City.

5. Said city shall have and is hereby given right of way for said conduit and access thereto to clean and repair the same.

That I, William C.
