DECLARATION OF BUILDING AND USE RESTRICTIONS

Part A. Preamble

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

THAT, WHEREAS, the undersigned, being the owners of the following described real property located in the City of Murray, Salt Lake County, State of Utah, to-wit:

Lots 1 to 48 inclusive, Aspen Heights Subdivision; according to the plat thereof, as recorded in the office of the County Recorder of

said County.

do hereby establish the mature of the use and enjoyment of all lots in said subdivision and do declare that all conveyances of said lots shall be made subject to the following conditions, restrictions and stipulations:

Part B. RESIDENTIAL AREA COVENANTS

- 1. Land Use and Building Type. No lot shall be used except for residential purposes. No building shall be erected, altered placed or permitted to remain on any lot other than one detached single family dwelling not to exceed two stories in height and private garages and/or carports for not more than three vehicles. All construction to be of new materials, except that used brick may be used with prior written consent of the Architectural Control Committee.
- 2. Architectural Control. No building shall be erected, placed or altered on any lot until the construction plans and specifications and a plan showing the location of the structurehave been approved by the Architectural Control Committee as to quality of workmanship and materials, harmony of external design with existing structures, and as to location with respect to topography and finish grade elevation. No fence or wall shall be erected, placed or altered on any lot nearer to any street than the minimum building set-back line unless similarly approved. Approval shall be as provided in Part C.
- 3. Dwelling Cost, Quality and Size. No dwelling shall be permitted on any lot at a cost of less than \$50,000.00 exclusive of lot, based upon cost levels prevailing on the date these covenants are recorded. This minimum shall be adjusted annually either up or down on the anniversary of the recording date by the same percentage as the most recently published National Cost of Living Index. The finished floor area of the main structure exclusive of one story open porches and garages, shall be not less than 1,200 square feet.
- 4. Building Location and Lot Use. a. Building location shall conform in all respects to the Murray City zoning and building codes as they now exist and as they may be amended.
- b. When construction of any building on any lot is once begun, work thereon shall be prosecuted diligently, and shall be completed within a reasonable time. No building shall be occupied during construction, or until passing Murray City final inspection and for which a certificate of occupancy as been issued.
- 5. Easement Easements for the installation and maintenance of utilities and drainage facilities are reserved as shown on the recorded plat. Within these easements, no structure, planting or other material shall be placed or permitted to remain which may damage or interfere with the installation and maintenance of utilities, or which may change the direction of flow of drainage channels in the easements, or which may obstruct or retard the flow of water through drainage

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channels in the easements. The easement area of each lot and all improvements in it shall be maintained continuously by the owner of the lot, except for those improvements for which a public authority or utility is responsible.

- No noxious or offensive activity shall be carried on upon any lot, nor shall anything be done thereon which may be or may become Nuisances. an annoyance or nuisance to the neighborhood. No clothes drying or storage of articles which are unsightly in the opinion of the Architectural Control Committee will be permitted in open areas of a lot. No automobiles, trailers, boats or other vehicles are to be stored on the street or on the lots unless they are in running condition, properly licensed and are being regularly used.
- No structures of a temporary character, trailer, basement, tent, shack, garage, barn or other outbuildings shall be used on any lot at any time as a residence either temporarily or permanently. No Mobile Homes are permitted.
- No signs of any kind shall be displayed to the public view on any lot except one professional sign of not more than one square foot, one sign of not more than five square feet advertising the property for sale or rent, or signs used by the builder to advertise the property during the construction and sales period.
- No livestock, animals, or poultry of any kind shall be raised, bred or kept on any lot, except that dogs, cats or other household pets may be kept provided that they are not kept, bred or maintained for any commercial purpose and are restricted to the owner's premises or on Livestock and Poultry. leash under handler's control.
- No lot shall be used or maintained a a dumping ground for rubbish. Trash, garbage or other waste shall not be kept except in sanitary containers. All incinerators or other equipment of the storage Garbage and Refuse Disposal. or disposal of such material shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition. Each lot and it's abutting street are to be kept free of trash, weeds and other refuse by the lot owner. No unsightly materials or other objects are to be stored on any lot in view of the general public.
- 11. Sight Distance at Intersections. No fence, wall, hedge or shrub planting which obstructs sight lines at elevations between 2 and 6 feet above the roadways shall be placed or permitted to remain on any corner lot within the triangular area formed by the street property lines and a line connecting them at points 25 feet from the intersection of the street lines or in case of a rounded corner from the intersection of the property lines extended. The same sight-line limitations shall apply on a driveway or alley pavement. No tree shall be permitted to remain within such distance of such interesection unless the foliage line is maintained at sufficient height to prevent obstruction of such sight lines
- No oil drilling, oil development Oil and Mining Operations. operations, oil refining, quarrying or mining operations of any kind shall be permitted upon or in any lot, nor shall oil wells, tanks, tunnels, mineral excavations or shafts be permitted upon or in any lot. No derrick or other structure designed for use in boring for oil or natural gas shall be erected, maintained or permitted upon any lot.

- 13. Landscaping. Trees, lawns, shrubs, or other plantings provided by the developer shall be properly nurtured and maintained or replaced at the property owner's expense upon request of the Architectural Control Committee.
- 14. Slope and Drainage Control. No structure, planting or other material shall be placed or permitted to remain or other activities undertaken which may damage or interfere with established slope ratios, create erosion or sliding problems, or which may change the direction of flow of drainage channels or obstruct or retard the flow of water through drainage channels. The slope control areas of each lot and all improvements in them shall be maintained continuously by the owner of the lot, except for those improvements for which a public authority or utility company is responsible.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE Part C.

- 1. Membership. A majority of the committee may designate a representative to act for it. In the event of death or resignation of any member of the committee, the remaining members of the committee shall have full authority to select a successor. Neither the members of the committee, nor its designated representative shall be entitled to any compensation for services performed pursuant to this covenant. At any time the then record owners of a majority of the lots shall have the power through a duly recorded written instrument to change the membership of the committee or to withdraw from the committeeor restore to it any of its powers and duties. The Architectural Control Committe is composed of
- 2. Procedure The Committee's approval or disapproval as required in these covenants shall be in writing. In the event the committee, or its designated representative, fails to approve or disapprove within 30 days after plans and specifications have been submitted to it, or in any event, if no suit to enjoin the construction has been commenced prior to the completion thereof, approval will not be required, and the related covenants shall be deemed to have been fully complied with.

PART D. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1. Term. These covenants are to run with the land and shall be binding on all parties and all persons slaiming under them for a period of twenty years from the date these covenants are recorded, after which time, said covenants shall be automatically extended for successive periods of ten years unless an instrument signed by the majority of the then owners of the lots has been recorded, agreeing to change said covenants in whole or in part.
- 2. Enforcement. Enforcement shall be by proceedings at law or in equity against any person or persons violating or attempting to violate any covenant either to restrain violation or to recover damages.
- 3. Severability. Invalidation of any one of these covenants by judgement or court order shall in no wise affect any of the other provisions which shall remain in full force and effect.
