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**DECLARATION OF COVENANTS
CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS OF
BANGERTER 15 CONDOMINIUMS**

THIS DECLARATION OF COVENANTS, CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS OF BANGERTER 15 CONDOMINIUMS, a commercial condominium project, is executed this 3rd day of April, 2007, by BANGERTER 15, L.C., (herein referred to as "Declarant")

RECITALS

- A. Capitalized terms in this Declaration are defined in Article I.
- B. The Declarant holds legal title to a certain tract of real property located in Salt Lake County, Utah, and more particularly described in Article II of this Declaration. It is intended that the various Units described in this Declaration will be conveyed to Owners in fee simple.
- C. By this Declaration, Declarant intends to establish a common scheme and plan for the possession, use, enjoyment, repair, maintenance, restoration and improvement of the Property and the interests therein conveyed and to establish thereon a planned commercial unit development in accordance with the terms hereof. Upon filing the property shall be subject to The Condominium Ownership Act, Utah Code Section 57-8-1 et seq.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby declared that the Property shall be held, sold, conveyed, leased, rented, encumbered and used, subject to the following Declaration and its covenants, restrictions, limitations, and conditions, all of which shall constitute covenants which run with the land and shall be binding on and be for the benefit of the Declarant, its successors and assigns and all owners of all or any part of the Property, together with their grantees, successors, heirs, executors, administrators, devisees and assigns, all as set forth herein.

ARTICLE I. DEFINITIONS

When used in this Declaration (including in that portion hereof headed "Recitals") the following terms shall have the meanings indicated.

- 1. "Article" or "Articles of Incorporation" shall mean and refer to the Articles of Incorporation which shall be filed with the Utah State Department of Commerce, Division of Corporations and Commercial Code at or about the time this Declaration is filed for record.
- 2. "Association" shall mean and refer to BANGERTER 15 CONDOMINIUMS Association, Inc., a Utah nonprofit association.
- 3. "Board of Trustees" or "Board" shall mean and refer to the governing board of the Association which shall be appointed or elected in accordance with the Declaration, the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Association.
- 4. "Bylaws" shall mean and refer to the Bylaws of the Association as amended from time to time.
- 5. "Common Areas" shall mean and refer to that part of the Property which is not included within the Units, including all roadways within the Project and all improvements other than utility lines now or hereafter constructed or located thereon and subject to the easements herein described.
- 5a. "Parking Based Development Rights" shall be attached to each unit at the time of conveyance from the Declarant. Draper City parking requirements are based on employees, usages and quantities of space. No unit shall be built out and used in such a manner that the number of required parking stalls by Draper City exceeds the "Parking Based Development Rights" attached to the unit. Said "Parking Based Development Rights" may only be possessed by an Owner or by the Declarant. All "Parking Based Development Rights" are possessed by the Declarant until such time as they are conveyed to owners of units.

6. "Common Expense Fund" shall mean and refer to the fund created or to be created pursuant to the Provisions of Article V of this Declaration and into which all monies of the Association shall be deposited. Two separate and distinct funds shall be created and maintained hereunder, one for operating expenses and one for capital expenses, which together shall constitute the Common Expense Fund
7. "Common Expenses" shall mean and refer to those costs and expenses arising out of or connected with the maintenance and operation of the Project and Association as described in Article V hereof and which determine the assessments made to Owners.
8. "Condominium Building" shall mean and refer to any or all of the structures on the Property; also to any structure or structures to be erected in the future on the vacant area of the property.
9. "Condominium Building Exterior" shall mean and refer to those portions of the Condominium Buildings which are open to the elements such as roofs, exterior walls, exterior doors, footings, and foundations.
10. "Declaration" shall mean and refer to this Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions of Bangert 15 Condominiums, as the same may hereafter be modified, amended and supplemented.
11. "Declarant" shall mean and refer to BANGERTER 15, L.C. , and/or any successors thereof which, either by operation of law or through a voluntary conveyance, transfer, or assignment, comes to stand in the same relation to the Property (or a portion thereof) as did its predecessor.
12. "Eligible Mortgagee" shall mean and refer to a First Mortgagee, which has requested notice of certain matters from the Association in accordance with Section 1 of Article XI of this Declaration.
13. "FNMA" shall mean and refer to the Federal National Mortgage Association.
14. "First Mortgage" shall mean any Mortgage which is not subject to any lien or encumbrance except liens for taxes or other liens which are given priority by statute.
15. "First Mortgagee" means any person named as a Mortgagee under a First Mortgage, or any successor to the interest of any such person under a First Mortgage, which First Mortgage is not subject to any lien or encumbrance except liens for taxes or other liens which are given priority by statute.
16. "Limited Common Areas" shall mean any Common Areas designated as reserved for use by the Owner of a certain Unit or Units to the exclusion of the other Owners in the Project. Such reservation shall commence when the Declarant conveys the exclusive use rights to an Owner. Said rights may only be possessed by an Owner or by the Declarant. Prior to any such conveyance, the Limited Common Area shall be treated as Common Area.
17. "Unit" shall mean and refer to any of the separately numbered and individually described units now or hereafter shown on the Plat. Except where the context specifically otherwise requires, reference to a Unit shall include reference to the Condominium thereon.
18. "Manager" shall mean and refer to the person, firm or company, if any, designated from time to time by the Association to manage, in whole or in part, the affairs of the Association and Project
19. "Member" shall mean and refer to every person who holds membership in the Association.
20. "Mortgage" shall mean any mortgage, deed of trust, or other document pledging any portion of a Unit or interest therein as security for the payment of a debt or obligation.
21. "Mortgagee" shall mean a beneficiary of a Mortgage as well as named Mortgagee.
22. "Owner" shall mean the person or persons, including the Declarant, owning in fee simple a Unit in

the Project, as such ownership is shown by the records of the County Recorder of Salt Lake County, State of Utah. The term "Owner" shall not refer to any Mortgagee (unless such Mortgagee has obtained title in fee simple to a Unit pursuant to a judicial or nonjudicial action, including, without limitations, a foreclosure proceeding or any deed or other arrangement in lieu of foreclosure) or to any person or persons purchasing a Unit under contract (until such contract is fully performed and legal title conveyed of record).

23. "Plat" shall mean and refer to the condominium map for Condominiums, recorded in the office of the County Recorder of Salt Lake County, Utah, and all amendments thereto.

24. "Project" shall mean and refer to the Property and the plan of development and ownership of the Property created and governed by this Declaration, the Articles and the Bylaws.

25. "Property" shall mean and refer to the entire tract of real property now or hereafter covered by the Plat. A description of the real property covered by the Plat on the effective date of this Declaration is set forth in Article II of this declaration.

ARTICLE II. PROPERTY DESCRIPTION

The Property initially associated with the Project which is and shall be held, transferred, sold, conveyed, and occupied subject to the provisions, easements and restrictions of this Declaration and the Plat consists of the following described real property situated in Salt Lake County, State of Utah:

CONDOMINIUM BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION

All of Lot 2, of the Bangerter 15 Subdivision Plat. Located in the Northeast Quarter of Section 1, Township 4 South, Range 1 West. Salt Lake Base & Meridian.

Also Described as:

Beginning 382.94 feet West and 48.54 feet North from the witness corner monument of the East Quarter of Section 1, Township 4 South, Range 1 West, Salt Lake Base & Meridian
Thence running North 295.79 feet; thence North 89°55'30" West 745.05 feet; Thence South 00°07'40" East 298.34 feet; Thence North 89°52'20" East 33.66 feet; Thence North 00°07'40" West 75.41 feet; Thence South 89°52'20" East 41.00 feet; Thence South 00°07'40" East 72.23 feet; Thence North 89°52'20" East 660.81 feet; Thence South Easterly along the arc of a 446.11 radius curve to the right a distance of 8.93 feet to the point of beginning. (Containing 218,105.5 Square feet, 5.0 Acres more or less)

The Condominium Buildings are as shown on the Condominium plat and are four structures with approximately 218,105.5 ground level square feet. All units are on the ground level, with no basements and with no Condominium Units being above or below other units. The principal building materials are concrete, steel, concrete masonry units and glass. Other significant improvements are contained in the Common Areas.

The Common Areas are as shown on the condominium plat and consist primarily of concrete sidewalk, asphalt parking, and landscaped areas, including approximately 172 parking stalls.

ARTICLE III. THE ASSOCIATION

1. Membership. Each Owner shall be entitled and required to be a Member of the Association. Membership will begin immediately and automatically upon becoming an Owner and shall terminate immediately and automatically upon ceasing to be an Owner. If title to a Unit is held by more than one person, the membership appurtenant to that Unit shall be shared by all such persons in the same proportionate interest and by the same type of tenancy in which title to the Unit is held. An Owner shall be entitled to one membership for each Unit owned by him. Each membership shall be appurtenant to the Unit to which it relates and shall be transferred automatically by conveyance of that Unit. Ownership of a Unit within the Project cannot be separated from membership in the

Association appurtenant thereto, and any devise, encumbrance, conveyance or other disposition of such Unit shall automatically constitute a devise, encumbrance, conveyance or other disposition of the Owner's membership in the Association and rights appurtenant thereto. No person or entity other than an Owner may be a Member of the Association and membership in the Association may not be transferred except in connection with the transfer of a Unit. The Association shall make available to the owners, Mortgagees and the holders, insurers and guarantors of the First Mortgage on any Unit current copies of the Declaration, Articles, Bylaws and other rules governing the Project, and other books, records and financial statements of the Association. The term "available" as used in this Section 1 shall mean available for inspection, upon request, during normal business hours or under other reasonable circumstances.

2. Board of Trustees. Until such time as the responsibility for electing the Board of Trustees of the Association is turned over to the Owners, the Declarant shall have the exclusive right to appoint and remove all such Trustees. This exclusive right of the Declarant to appoint the Trustees shall terminate after the first to occur of the following:

A. Three years from the date on which the first Unit in the Project is conveyed;

Or

B. Four months after seventy-five per cent (75%) of the Units have been conveyed by Declarant.

3. Votes. Each Member shall be entitled to the number of votes appurtenant to his or her Unit, as set forth on **Exhibit "A"**, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. The number of votes appurtenant to each Unit has been determined by the relatively equal size of each Unit. Accordingly, the Owner of each Unit shall be entitled to the number of votes shown on **Exhibit "A"** for each Unit owned. The number of votes appurtenant to each Unit shall be permanent, and shall not change in the event an Owner modifies a Unit to increase or decrease the size of his Unit relative to other Units. In the event that there is more than one Owner of a particular Unit, the votes relating to such Unit shall be exercised as such Owners may determine among themselves. No Unit shall have more than the number of votes shown on **Exhibit "A"**, regardless of the number of persons having an ownership interest in the Unit. The votes cast at any Association meeting by any of such Owners, whether in person or by proxy, shall be conclusively presumed to be the votes attributable to the Unit concerned unless an objection is immediately made by another Owner of the same Unit. In the event such an objection is made, the votes involved shall not be counted for any purpose whatsoever other than to determine whether a quorum exists. The Declarant shall have full voting rights with respect to each Unit which it owns.

4. Maintenance of Condominium Building Exteriors The Association shall maintain all Condominium Building Exteriors as follows: paint, repair, replacement and care of roofs, roof joists, gutters, downspouts, foundations, exterior building surfaces, exterior doors and other exterior improvements, as well as all trees, shrubs, grass, walks and steps located on or around a Unit. Such exterior maintenance shall not include roof leaks around penetrations in the roofing field or glass surfaces included on any Unit. It is recommended Owners creating roof penetrations utilize the original roofing contractor to properly seal any such penetrations. The Association shall have the right of entry to any Unit to perform emergency repairs or do other work necessary for maintenance of the Condominium Building Exteriors.

In the event that the need for maintenance or repair of the Condominium Building Exteriors is caused through the willful or negligent acts of its Owner(s), or through the willful or negligent acts of the guests, tenants or invitees of the Owner(s) of the Unit needing such maintenance or repair, the cost of such exterior maintenance shall be immediately due and payable and added to and become a part of the assessment to which such Unit is subject.

5. Professional Management. The Association may carry out through the Manager those of its functions which are properly the subject of delegation. The Manager so engaged shall be an independent contractor and not an agent or employee of the Association, shall be responsible for managing the Project for the benefit of the Association and the Owners, and shall to the extent permitted by law and by the terms of the agreement with the Association, be authorized to perform any of the functions or acts required or permitted to be performed by the Association itself. Any such management agreement executed on or before the termination of Declarant's control of the appointment of the Board of Trustees as described in Section 2 of Article III may be terminated by the

Association without cause at any time after termination of such control. The above term end termination provisions shall not apply to any other types of service contracts.

6. Amplification. The provisions of this Section may be amplified by the Articles and the Bylaws; provided, however, that no such amplification shall substantially alter or amend any of the rights or obligations of the Owners set forth in this Declaration.

ARTICLE IV. PROPERTY RIGHTS IN COMMON AREAS AND UNITS

1. Easement of Enjoyment. Each Member shall have an undivided interest, right and easement of use and enjoyment in and to the Common Areas. Each Owner shall have an unrestricted right of ingress or egress to and from its Unit over and across such Common Areas. Each Owner shall also have the exclusive right, subject to any easements, to use and enjoy any Limited Common Areas that may be designated for exclusive use by such Owner. Such rights and easements shall be appurtenant to and shall pass with title to each Unit and in no event shall be separated therefrom.

Any Member may delegate the right and easement of use and enjoyment described herein to any guest, tenant, lessee, contract purchaser, or other person who occupies or utilizes such Member's Unit.

2. Easements for Encroachments. In the event the construction, reconstruction, repair, shifting, settlement or any other movement of any portion of the improvements causes any part of a Unit built in substantial accord with the boundaries for such Unit as depicted on the Plat to encroach upon the Common Areas, or upon an adjoining Unit, or if any part of the Common Areas encroaches or shall encroach upon a Unit for any such reasons, an easement for such encroachment and for the maintenance of the same shall and does exist. There is also hereby created an easement for any encroachment by any roof overhang upon an adjoining Unit or any part of the Common Areas.

3. Limitation on Easement. A Member's undivided interest, right and easement of use and enjoyment concerning the Common Areas shall be subject to the following:

A. The right of the Association to suspend a Member's voting right in the Association for any period during which (i) an assessment on such Member's Unit remains unpaid; (ii) for a period not exceeding sixty (60) days for any infraction by such Member of the provisions of this Declaration or of any rule or regulation promulgated by the Association; and (iii) for successive 60-day periods if any such infraction is not corrected during any prior 60 day suspension period;

B. The right of the Association to (1) impose reasonable limitations on the number of guests per Member who at any given time are permitted to use the Common Areas; and (2) allocate and/or assign specific parking spaces or a number of specific parking spaces to each Owner based on the Common Area Parking Based Development Rights belonging to each owner. Unless so allocated, and or assigned, no parking spaces are reserved and all are common. Parking is limited to marked parking stalls.

C. The right of any governmental or quasi-governmental body having jurisdiction over the Property to access, and rights of ingress and egress over and across any street, parking area, walkway, or open area contained within the property for purposes of providing police and fire protection and other governmental or municipal service;

D. Any easements or rights of way set forth herein or as a matter of public record.

4. Party Walls. Each wall or ceiling-floor physical boundary which is built and placed on the dividing line (whether horizontal or vertical) between the Units shall constitute a "Party Wall" and, to the extent not inconsistent with the provisions of this Section, the general rules of law regulating party walls and liability for property damage due to negligence or willful acts or omissions shall apply to all Party Walls within the Project. The cost of reasonable repair and maintenance of a Party Wall shall be shared equally by the Owners who make use of such Party Wall, including the installation of utilities therein. If a Party Wall is destroyed or damaged by fire or

other casualty, the provisions of Article VII hereof shall apply. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, an Owner who by his negligent or willful act causes a Party Wall to be damaged shall bear the entire cost of furnishing repairs to the Party Wall. The right of any Owner to contribution from any other Owner under this Section shall be appurtenant to the land and shall pass to Such Owner's successors in title.

5. Form for Conveyancing. Any deed, lease, mortgage, deed of trust, or other instrument conveying or encumbering title to a Unit may describe the interest or estate involved substantially as follows:

"Unit No. _____ of the BANGERTER 15 CONDOMINIUMS, together with Parking Based Development Rights in the number of _____, together with all improvements located thereon, as said Unit is identified in the Plat of said development and in the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions of BANGERTER 15 CONDOMINIUMS, both recorded in the Recorder's Office of Salt Lake County, State of Utah. TOGETHER WITH a right and easement of use and enjoyment in and to the Common Areas described, and as provided for, in said Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions."

Or in the case of Parking Based Development Rights:

"Parking Based Development Rights in the number of _____ of the BANGERTER 15 CONDOMINIUMS, as such is identified in the Plat recorded in the Recorder's Office of Salt Lake County, State of Utah."

Whether or not the description employed in any such instrument is in the above specified form, however, all provisions of this Declaration shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of any party who acquires any interest in a Unit.

6. Transfer of Title. The Declarant agrees to cause the conveyance to the Association of title to the Common Area.

ARTICLE V. ASSESSMENTS

1. Agreement to Pay Assessments. The Declarant for each Unit owned by it within the Project and each Owner of any Unit by the acceptance of instruments of conveyance and transfer therefor, whether or not it be so expressed in said instruments, shall be deemed to covenant and agree with each other and with the Association to pay to the Association all assessments made by the Association for the purposes provided in this Declaration. Such assessments shall be fixed, established and collected from time to time as provided in this Article V. In any event, all Units shall be allocated the then applicable assessments upon conveyance of the first Unit.

A. From and after January 1 of the year immediately following the conveyance of the first Unit to an Owner, the maximum annual assessment may be increased each year by up to fifteen percent (15%) above the maximum assessment for the previous year without a vote of the membership.

B. From and after January 1 of the year immediately following the conveyance of the first Unit to an Owner, the maximum annual assessment may be increased above fifteen percent (15%) only by a vote of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the votes (determined in accordance with Section 3 of Article III) of Members who are voting in person or by proxy, at a meeting duly called for this purpose.

C. The Board may fix the annual assessment at an amount not in excess of the maximum.

2. Annual Assessments. Annual assessments shall be computed and assessed against all Units in the project as follows:

A. Common Expense. Annual assessments shall be based upon advance estimates of the Association's cash requirements to provide for payment of all estimated expenses arising out of or connected with the maintenance and operation of the Common Areas, the Condominium Building Exteriors, and furnishing common utility services and other common items to the Units. Such estimated expenses may include, without limitation, the following: expenses of management; real property taxes and special assessments on the Common Areas (and the Units until the Units are separately assessed);

premiums for all insurance that the association is required or permitted to maintain hereunder; repairs, maintenance and cleaning of the Common Areas and Condominium Building Exteriors; landscaping; snow removal; wages of Association employees, including fees for a Manager; trash removal; utility charges, including charges for utility services to the Units to the extent not separately metered or billed; legal and accounting fees; any deficit remaining from a previous period; creation of an adequate contingency reserve, for maintenance reserve and/or sinking fund; creation of an adequate reserve fund for maintenance repairs, and replacement of those Common Areas and Condominium Building Exteriors that must be replaced on a periodic basis; and any other expenses and liabilities which may be incurred by the Association for the benefit of the Owners under or by reason of this Declaration. The aggregate of all such items shall constitute the Common Expense Fund. Two separate and distinct funds shall be created and maintained hereunder, one for operating expenses and one for capital expenses which together shall constitute the Common Expense Fund.

B. Apportionment. Common Expenses shall be apportioned among and assessed to all Units and their Owners based on relative Unit approximate square footage, as set forth on **Exhibit "A"**, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. The Declarant shall be liable for the amount of any assessments against Units owned by it.

C. Annual Budget. Annual assessments shall be determined on the basis of a calendar year provided the first year shall begin on the date of the conveyance of the first Unit by Declarant. On or before each annual Owners Association meeting (the last Tuesday of each January) the Board of Trustees shall prepare and furnish to each Owner, or cause to be prepared and furnished to each owner, an operating budget for that year. The budget shall itemize the estimated expenses of Common Expense for such year, anticipated receipts (if any) and any deficit or surplus from the prior operating period. The budget shall serve as the supporting document for the annual assessment for that year and as the major guideline under which the Project shall be operated during such annual period.

D. Notice and Payment. Except with respect to the first year, the Board of Trustees shall notify each Owner in writing as to the amount of the annual assessment against his or her Unit at the annual Owners' meeting, or as soon as reasonably practical after the annual Owners Association meeting. Except as otherwise provided by the Board, each annual assessment shall be payable in two (2) equal semi-annual installments, the first installment being due on or before February 15, and the second installment being due on or before July 1; provided, however, the annual assessment for the first year shall be based upon such portion of the first year. All unpaid installments of any annual assessment shall bear interest at the rate established by the Board not to exceed eighteen percent (18%) per annum from fifteen (15) days after the date each such installment becomes due until paid. The Board of Trustees shall also have the right to assess a late fee of up to five percent (5%) of any assessment installment not paid within fifteen (15) days following the due date thereof. The failure of the Board of Trustees to give timely notice of any annual assessment as provided herein shall not be deemed a waiver or modification in any respect of the provisions of this Declaration, or a release of any Owner from the obligation to pay such assessment or any other assessment.

E. Inadequate Funds. In the event that the Common Expense Fund proves inadequate at any time for whatever reason, including nonpayment of any Owner's assessment, the Board of Trustees may, on behalf of the Association, levy additional assessments in accordance with the procedure set forth in Article V Section 3 below, except that the vote therein specified shall be unnecessary.

3. Special Assessments. In addition to the annual assessments authorized by this Article, the Board of Trustees may, on behalf of the Association, levy, at any time and from time to time, upon the affirmative vote of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the voting power of the Association in person or by proxy at a meeting called for such purpose, special assessments, payable over such periods as the Board of Trustees may determine, for the purpose of defraying, in whole or in part, the cost of any conversion, expansion, construction or reconstruction, unexpected repair or replacement of the Project or any part thereof, or for any other expenses incurred or to be incurred as provided in this Declaration (including, without limitation, Common Expenses). This Section shall not be construed as an independent source of authority for the Association to incur expenses but shall be construed to prescribe the manner of assessing for expenses authorized by other Sections or Articles hereof. Any amounts assessed pursuant hereto shall be assessed to Owners in accordance with the assessment percentages allocated to each Unit, as set forth on **Exhibit "A"**. Notice in writing of the amount of each such special assessment and the time for payment thereof

shall be given promptly to the Owners; no payment shall be due less than fifteen (15) days after such notice shall have been given. All unpaid portions of any special assessment shall bear interest at the rate established by the Board not to exceed eighteen percent (18%) per annum from the date such portions become due until paid. All funds received from assessments under this Section shall be part of the Common Expense Fund. In connection with any such special assessment, if the Declarant is only obligated to pay twenty-five percent (25%) of the annual assessment attributable to Units it owns pursuant to Section 4 below, it shall only be required to pay twenty-five percent (25%) of the special assessment otherwise attributable to each such Unit. The provisions of this Section are not intended to preclude the assessment, collection or use of annual assessment for the aforesaid purposes.

4. Rate of Assessment. The amount of any annual or special assessment against each Unit shall be fixed at a rate based on the assessment percentages allocated to each Unit, as set forth on Exhibit "A".

5. Notice and Quorum for Any Action Authorized Under Sections 1 and 3. Written notice of any meeting called for the purpose of taking any action authorized under Sections 1 or 3 of this Article shall be sent to all Members no less than thirty (30) days nor more than sixty (60) days in advance of the meeting. At the first such meeting called, the presence of members or of proxies entitled to cast one-half (1/2) of all the votes (exclusive of suspended voting rights) of Members shall constitute a quorum. If the required quorum is not present, another meeting may be called subject to the same notice requirement, and the required quorum at the subsequent meeting shall be one-half (1/2) of the required quorum at the preceding meeting. No such subsequent meeting shall be held more than sixty (60) days following the preceding meeting.

6. Lien for Assessments. All sums assessed to Owners of any Unit within the Project pursuant to the provisions of this Article V, together with penalties and interest thereon as provided herein, shall be secured by a lien on such Unit in favor of the Association. To evidence a lien for sums assessed pursuant to this Article V, the Board of Trustees may prepare a written notice of lien setting forth the amount of the assessment, the date due, the amount remaining unpaid, the name of the Owner of the Unit and a description of the Unit. Such a notice shall be signed and acknowledged by a duly authorized officer of the Association and may be recorded in the office of the County Recorder of Salt Lake County, State of Utah. No notice of lien shall be recorded until there is a delinquency in payment of the assessment. Such lien may be enforced by sale or foreclosure conducted in accordance with the provisions of law applicable to the exercise of powers of sale or judicial foreclosure of deeds of trust or mortgages or in any other manner permitted by law. In any such foreclosure, the Owner shall be required to pay the costs and expenses of such proceeding (including reasonable attorneys' fees), and such costs and expenses shall be secured by the lien being foreclosed. The Owner shall also be required to pay to the Association any assessment against the Unit which shall become due during the period of foreclosure, and all such assessments shall be secured by the lien being foreclosed. The Board of Trustees shall have the right and power on behalf of the Association to bid in at any foreclosure sale and to hold, lease, mortgage or convey the subject Unit in the name of the Association.

7. Personal Obligation of Owner. The amount of any annual or special assessment against any Unit shall be the personal obligation of the Owner of such Unit to the Association. Suit to recover a money judgment for such personal obligation shall be maintainable by the Association without foreclosing or waiving the lien securing the same. No Owner may avoid or diminish any such personal obligation by waiver of the use and enjoyment of any of the Common Areas or by abandonment of this Unit or by waiving any services or amenities provided for in this Declaration. In the event of any suit to recover a money judgment of unpaid assessment hereunder, the involved Owner shall pay the costs and expenses incurred by the Association in connection therewith, including reasonable attorneys' fees.

8. Personal Liability of Purchaser. The personal obligation of an Owner to pay unpaid assessments against his Unit as described in Section 7 of this Article V shall not pass to successors in title unless assumed by them. Provided, however, a lien to secure unpaid assessments shall not be affected by the sale or transfer of the Unit unless foreclosure by a First Mortgagee is involved, in which case the foreclosure will extinguish the lien for any assessments that were payable before the foreclosure sale, but shall not relieve any subsequent Owner from paying further assessments.

9. Reserves and Working Capital. In addition to its day-to-day operating funds, the Association shall establish the following funds:

A. Reserve Fund. The Association may in its sole discretion establish and maintain an adequate reserve fund for the periodic maintenance, repair and replacement of improvements to the

Common Areas and Condominium Building Exteriors the Association is obligated to maintain, repair or replace. The reserve fund shall be maintained out of regular assessments for Common Expenses.

B. Working Capital Fund. The Declarant shall establish and maintain for the Project, a working capital fund equal to at least twenty-five per cent (25%) of the annual assessment of each Unit. Each Unit's share of the working capital fund must be collected and transferred to the Association at the time of the closing of sale of that Unit. The working capital fund need not be maintained in a segregated account. The purpose of the working capital fund is to ensure that the Association will have cash available to meet initial operating expenses and unforeseen expenditures, to acquire additional equipment or services deemed necessary or desirable by the Association and to provide any needed funds during the first two (2) months of each year while the Association awaits receipt of the annual assessment payments from the Owners. Amounts paid into the working capital fund are not to be considered advance payments of any regular assessment. The working capital fund shall be transferred to the Association for deposit to a segregated fund when control of the Association is transferred to the Owners. The Declarant shall not use the working capital fund to defray any of its expenses, reserve contributions, or construction costs or to make up any budget deficits while it is in control of the Association.

10. Evidence of Payment of Annual and Special Assessments. Upon receipt of a written request by a Member or any other person, the Association within a reasonable period of time thereafter shall issue to such Member or other person a written certificate stating (a) that all annual and special assessments (including interest, costs and attorneys' fees, if any, as provided in Section 2 above) have been paid with respect to any specified Unit as of the date of such certificate, or (b) if all annual and special assessments have not been paid, the amount of such annual and special assessments (including interest, costs and attorneys' fees, if any) due and payable as of such date. The Association may make a reasonable charge for the issuance of such certificates, which charges must be paid at the time the request for any such certificate is made. Any such certificate, when duly issued as herein provided, shall be conclusive and binding with respect to any matter therein stated as against any bona fide purchaser of, or Mortgagee on, the Unit in question.

ARTICLE VI. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

1. Maintenance of Units. Each Unit shall be maintained by the Owner thereof so as not to detract from the appearance of the Property and so as not to affect adversely the value or use of any other Unit, including heating each Unit sufficient to keep water pipes from freezing. In the event any Unit Owner has exclusive use rights to any Limited Common Area and any structure exists on said Limited Common Area, the Unit Owner shall have the same maintenance responsibilities on said structure as he has on the Unit. The Association shall have no obligation regarding maintenance or care of Units except as set forth in Section 2 of this Article VI or elsewhere in this Declaration.

2. Operation and Maintenance by Association. The Association shall provide for such maintenance and operation of the Common Areas including sewer laterals as may be necessary or desirable to make them appropriately usable in conjunction with the Units and to keep them clean, functional, attractive and generally in good condition and repair. The Association shall also provide for the maintenance of all Condominium Building Exteriors. The expenses incurred by the Association for such purposes shall be paid for with funds from the Common Expense Fund.

3. Utilities. The Owner shall pay for all utility services furnished to each Unit except utility services which are not separately billed or metered to individual Units by the utility or other party furnishing such service. The Association shall pay such bills which are not separately metered and charge an appropriate share to each Unit and Owner as part of the Common Expenses. The Owners Association will operate and maintain all of the sewer laterals, and pay sewer bills. The liability associated with a sewer lateral back up shall be the responsibility of the owners, or the Owners Association, and not the Sewer District.

4. Insurance. The Association shall at all times maintain in force insurance meeting the following requirements:

A. Hazard Insurance. A "master" or "blanket" type policy of property insurance shall be maintained covering the entire Project, including: Common Areas; all Condominium Buildings including

all Units (other than the interior content and demising walls thereof); fixtures, building service equipment, personal property and supplies comprising a part of the Common Areas or owned by the Association, and which are of a class typically encumbered by Mortgages held by FNMA or other similar institutional Mortgage investors; but excluding land, foundations, excavations, and other items normally not covered by such policies. References herein to a "master" or "blanket" type policy of property insurance are intended to denote single entity insurance coverage. As a minimum, such "master" or "blanket" policy shall afford protection against loss or damage by fire, by other perils normally covered by the standard extended coverage endorsement, and by all other perils which are customarily covered with respect to projects similar to the Project in construction, location, and use, including (without limitation) all perils normally covered by the standard "all risk" endorsement, where such endorsement is available. Such "master" or "blanket" policy shall be in an amount not less than one hundred percent (100%) of current replacement cost of all elements of the Project covered by such policy, exclusive of land, foundations, excavation, and other items normally excluded from coverage. The insurance policy shall include either of the following endorsements to assure full insurable value replacement cost coverage: (1) a Guaranteed Replacement Cost Endorsement (under which the insurer agrees to replace the insurable property regardless of the cost) and, if the policy includes a co-insurance clause, an Agreed Amount Endorsement (which waives the requirement for co-insurance; or (2) a Replacement Cost Endorsement (under which the insurer agrees to pay up to one-hundred percent of the property's insurable replacement cost but no more) and, if the policy includes a co-insurance clause, an Agreed Amount Endorsement (which waives the requirement for co-insurance).. The maximum deductible amount for such policy covering the Common Areas shall be the lesser of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) or one percent (1%) of the policy face amount. However, for losses related to individual Units that are covered by such a policy, the deductible related to each individual Unit shall be One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000). Funds to cover these deductible amounts shall be included in the Association's operating reserve account

B. Flood Insurance. If any part of the Project is or comes to be situated in a Special Flood Hazard Area as designated on a Flood Insurance Rate Map, a "master" or "blanket" policy of flood insurance shall be maintained covering the Condominium Buildings, any machinery and equipment that are not part of a Condominium Building and all Common Areas within the Project (hereinafter "Insurable Property") in an amount deemed appropriate, but not less than the lesser of (1) the maximum limit of coverage available under the National Flood Insurance Administration Program for all Condominium Buildings and Insurable Property within any portion of the Project located within a designated flood hazard area; or (2) one hundred percent (100%) of the insurable value of all such facilities. The maximum deductible amount for any such policy shall be the lesser of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or one percent (1%) of the policy face amount.

(i) The name of the insured under each policy required to be maintained by the foregoing A and B shall be the Association for the use and benefit of the individual Owners. (Said Owners shall be designated by name, if required.) Notwithstanding the requirement of the two immediately foregoing sentences, each such policy may be issued in the name of an authorized representative of the Association, including any Insurance Trustee with whom the Association has entered into an Insurance Trust Agreement, or any successor to such Trustee, for the use and benefit of the individual Owners. Loss payable shall be in favor of the Association (or Insurance Trustee), as a trustee for each Owner and each such Owner's Mortgagee. Each Owner and each such Owner's Mortgagee, if any, shall be beneficiaries of such policy. Evidence of insurance shall be issued to each Owner and Mortgagee upon request.

(ii) Each policy required to be maintained by the foregoing items A and B, shall contain the standard mortgage clause, or equivalent endorsement (without contribution), commonly accepted by private institutional mortgage investors in the area in which the Project is located. If FNMA is a holder of one or more Mortgages on Units within the Project, such mortgage clause shall name FNMA or FNMA's servicer of such Mortgages as Mortgagee. If FNMA's servicer is named as mortgagee in such mortgage clause, such servicer's name shall be followed therein by the phrase "its successors and assigns." In addition, such mortgage clause or another appropriate provision of each such policy shall provide that the policy may not be cancelled or substantially modified without at least ten (10) days' prior written notice to the Association and to each Mortgagee which is listed as a scheduled holder of a Mortgage in the policy.

(iii) Each policy required to be maintained by the foregoing items A and B, shall provide, if available, for the following: recognition of any insurance trust agreement; a waiver of the right of subrogation against Owners individually; the insurance is not prejudiced by any act or neglect of individual Owners which is not in the control of such Owners collectively; and the policy is primary in the event the Owner has other insurance covering the same loss.

(iv) Each policy required to be maintained by the foregoing item A shall also contain or provide the following: (1) "Inflation Guard Endorsement", if available; and (2) "building Ordinance or Law Endorsement", if the enforcement of any building, zoning, or land use law will result in loss or damage, increased cost of repairs or reconstruction, or additional demolition and removal costs. (The endorsement must provide for contingent liability from the operation of building laws, demolition costs, and increased costs of reconstruction)

C. Liability Insurance. The Association shall maintain in force, and pay the premium for a policy providing comprehensive general liability insurance coverage covering all of the Common Areas, Condominium Building Exteriors, public ways in the Project, including any dedicated trail system(s), all other areas of the Project that are under the Association's supervision, and commercial spaces owned by the Association, if any, whether or not such spaces are leased to some third party. The coverage limits under such policy shall be in amounts generally required by private institutional Mortgage investors for projects similar to the Project in construction, location, and use. Nevertheless, such coverage shall be for at least One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for bodily injury, including deaths of persons, and property damage arising out of a single occurrence. Coverage under such policy shall include, without limitation, legal liability of the insureds for property damage, bodily injuries and deaths of persons in connection with the operation, maintenance, or use of the Common Areas, and/or Condominium Building Exteriors, and legal liability arising out of lawsuits related to employment contracts of the Association. Additional coverages under such policy shall include protection against such other risks as are customarily covered with respect to projects similar to the Project in construction, location, and use, including but not limited to (where economically feasible and if available), host liquor liability, contractual and all-written contract insurance, employers liability insurance, and comprehensive automobile liability insurance. If such policy does not include "severability of interest" in the terms, the policy shall include a special endorsement to preclude an insurer's denial of any Owner's claim because of negligent acts of the Association or any other Owner. Such policy shall provide that it may not be cancelled or substantially modified, by any party, without at least ten (10) days' prior written notice to the Association and to each Mortgagee which is listed as a scheduled holder of a Mortgage in such policy.

D. Insurance Trustees and General Requirements Concerning Insurance. Notwithstanding any of the foregoing provisions and requirements relating to property or liability insurance, there may be named as an insured on behalf of the Association, the Association's authorized representative, including any trustee with whom the Association may enter into any Insurance Trust Agreement or any successor to such trustee (each of whom shall be referred to herein as the "Insurance Trustee"), who shall have exclusive authority to negotiate losses under any policy providing such property or liability insurance. Each Owner hereby appoints the Association, or any Insurance Trustee or substitute Insurance Trustee designated by the Association, as his or her attorney-in-fact for the purpose of purchasing and maintaining such insurance, including: the collection and appropriate disposition of the proceeds thereof; the negotiation of losses and execution of releases of liability; the execution of all documents; and the performance of all other acts necessary to accomplish such purpose. The Association, or any Insurance Trustee, shall receive, hold, or otherwise properly dispose of any proceeds of insurance in trust for the use and benefit of the Owners and their Mortgagees, as their interests may appear.

Each insurance policy maintained pursuant to the foregoing Sections, A, B, and C shall be written by an insurance carrier which is licensed to transact business in the State of Utah and which has a B general policyholder's rating or a financial performance index of 6 or better in the Best's Key Rating Guide or an A or better rating from Demotech, Inc., or which is written by Lloyd's of London. No such policy shall be maintained where: (1) under the terms of the carrier's charter, bylaws, or policy, contributions may be required from, or assessments may be made against, an Owner, a Mortgagee, the Board, the Association,

FNMA, or the designee of FNMA; (2) by the terms of the carrier's charter, bylaws, or policy, loss payments are contingent upon action by the carrier's board of directors, policyholders, or members; or (3) the policy includes any limiting clauses (other than insurance conditions) which could prevent the party entitled (including, without limitation, the Board, the Association, an Owner, or FNMA) from collecting insurance proceeds. The provisions of this Section D and of the foregoing sections A, B, and C shall not be construed to limit the power or authority of the Association to obtain and maintain insurance coverage, in addition to any insurance coverage required hereunder, in such amounts and in such forms as the Association may deem appropriate from time to time.

E. Annual Review of Policies. All insurance policies shall be reviewed at least annually by the Board in order to ascertain whether the coverage contained in the policies is sufficient to make any necessary repairs or replacement of the Project which may have been damaged or destroyed. In addition, such policies shall be reviewed to determine their compliance with the provisions of this declaration.

ARTICLE VII. DAMAGE OR DESTRUCTION

1. Association as Attorney in Fact. All of the Owners irrevocably constitute and appoint the Association their true and lawful attorney in fact in their name, place and stead for the purpose of dealing with the Project upon its damage or destruction as hereinafter provided. Acceptance by any grantee of a deed from the Declarant or from any Owner shall constitute an appointment by said grantee of the Association as his or her attorney-in-fact as herein provided. As attorney-in-fact, the Association shall have full and complete authorization, right and power to make, execute and deliver any contract, deed or other instrument with respect to the interest of an Owner which may be necessary or appropriate to exercise the powers herein granted. All insurance proceeds shall be payable to the Association except as otherwise provided in this Declaration.

2. Definition of Repair and Reconstruction. Repair and reconstruction of the improvements as used herein means restoring the project to substantially the same condition in which it existed prior to the damage or destruction, with each Unit and the Common Areas having substantially the same vertical and horizontal boundaries as before.

3. Procedure. In the event all or any part of the project is damaged or destroyed, the Association shall proceed as follows:

A. Notice to First Mortgagees. The Association shall give timely written notice to any holder of any First Mortgage on a Unit or who requests such notice in writing in the event of substantial damage to or destruction of any part of the Common Areas or a Unit subject to such First Mortgage.

B. As soon as practicable after an event causing damage to or destruction of any part of the Project, the Association shall obtain complete and reliable estimates of the costs to repair and reconstruct the part of the Project damaged or destroyed.

C. Sufficient Insurance. If the proceeds of the insurance maintained by the Association equal or exceed the estimated costs to repair and reconstruct the damaged or destroyed part of the Project, such repair and reconstruction shall be carried out.

D. Insufficient Insurance--Less than Seventy-Five Percent (75%) Destruction. If the proceeds of the insurance maintained by the Association are less than the estimated costs to repair and reconstruct the damaged or destroyed part of the Project and if less than seventy-five percent (75%) of the Project is damaged or destroyed, such repair and reconstruction shall nevertheless be carried out. The Association shall levy a special assessment sufficient to provide funds to pay the actual costs of such repair and reconstruction to the extent that such insurance proceeds are insufficient to pay such costs. Such special assessment shall be allocated and collected as provided in Article V Section 3 hereof, except that the vote therein specified shall be unnecessary. Further levies may be made in like manner if the amounts collected (together with the proceeds of insurance) are insufficient to pay all actual costs of such repair and reconstruction.

E. Insufficient Insurance--Seventy-Five Percent (75%) or More Destruction. If the proceeds

of the insurance maintained by the Association are less than the estimated costs to repair and reconstruct the damaged or destroyed part of the Project and if seventy-five percent (75%) or more of the Project is damaged or destroyed, such damage or destruction shall be repaired and reconstructed, but only if within one hundred (100) days following the damage or destruction, Owners entitled to vote at least seventy-five percent (75%) of the votes of the Members vote to carry out such repair and reconstruction. If, however, the Owners do not within one hundred (100) days after such damage or destruction, elect by a vote of at least seventy-five percent (75%) of the votes of the Members to carry out such repair and reconstruction but rather elect to terminate the project and if Eligible Mortgagees who represent at least fifty-one Percent (51%) of the votes of Units subject to Mortgages held by Eligible Mortgagees approve such termination, the Association shall record in the office of the County Recorder of Salt Lake County, State of Utah, a notice setting forth such facts. Upon the recording of such notice, the following shall occur:

- (i) The Project shall be deemed to be owned in common by the Owners,
- (ii) Each Owner shall own an undivided interest in the project equal to such Owner's Common Expense allocation percentage as set forth on **Exhibit "A"**;
- (iii) Any liens affecting any of the Units shall be deemed to be transferred, in accordance with the existing priorities, to the undivided interest of the respective Owner in the Project; and
- (iv) The Project shall be subject to an action for partition at the suit of any Owner, in which event the net proceeds of any sale resulting from such suit for partition, together with the net proceeds of the insurance of the project, if any, shall be considered as one fund and shall be divided among all Owners after first paying out of the respective share of each Owner, to the extent sufficient for the purposes, all liens on the undivided interest in the Project owned by such Owner. The division of funds shall be based on the fair market values of the Units immediately prior to the damage or destruction, and the Owners shall divide said funds based upon the relative value of the Units prior to the damage or destruction.

F. In no event shall an Owner of a Unit or any other party have priority over the holder of any First Mortgage on such Unit with respect to the distribution to such Unit of any insurance proceeds.

4. Repair or Reconstruction. If the damage or destruction is to be repaired or reconstructed as provided above, the Association shall, as soon as practicable after receiving the said estimate of cost, commence and diligently pursue to completion the repair and reconstruction of that part of the Project damaged or destroyed. The Association may take all necessary or appropriate action to effect repair and reconstruction, as attorney in fact for the Owners, and no consent or other action by any Owner shall be necessary in connection therewith, except as otherwise expressly provided herein. The Project shall be restored or repaired to substantially the same condition in which it existed prior to the damage or destruction, with each Unit and the Common Areas having the same vertical and horizontal boundaries as before. Any restoration or repair of the Project, after a partial condemnation or damage due to an insurable hazard, shall be performed substantially in accordance with the Declaration and the original architectural plans and specifications.

5. Disbursement of Funds for Repair and Reconstruction. If repair or reconstruction is to occur, the insurance proceeds held by the Association and any amounts received from assessments made pursuant to Section 3 D of this Article VII shall constitute a fund for the payment of costs of repair and reconstruction after casualty. It shall be deemed that the first money disbursed in payment for costs of repair and reconstruction shall be made from insurance proceeds; if there is a balance after payment of all costs of such repair and reconstruction, such balance shall be distributed to the Owners equally.

6. Amendment of Article. This Article VII shall not be amended unless Owners entitled to vote at least seventy-five percent (75%) of the votes of the Members consent and agree to such amendment and such consent and agreement is reflected in an instrument duly executed by the Board of Trustees of the Association and recorded in accordance with the provisions of this Declaration.

ARTICLE VIII. CONDEMNATION

1. Condemnation. If at any time or times all or any part of the Project shall be taken or condemned by any public authority under power of eminent domain, the provisions of this article shall apply. A voluntary sale or conveyance of all or any part of the Project in lieu of condemnation, but under threat of condemnation, shall be deemed to be a taking by power of eminent domain. If any Unit or portion thereof or the Common Areas or any portion thereof is made the subject matter of any condemnation or eminent domain proceeding or is otherwise sought to be acquired by a condemning authority, the Board of Trustees shall give prompt written notice of any such proceeding or proposed acquisition to each Owner in the Project and to any First Mortgagee who has requested in writing notice thereof. The Association shall represent the Owners in any condemnation proceedings or in negotiations, settlements and agreements with the condemning authority for acquisition of the Common Areas, or any part thereof, and each Owner hereby appoints the Association as such Owner's attorney-in-fact for the purposes of such representation.

2. Proceeds. All compensation, damages and other proceeds from any such taking by power of eminent domain (hereinafter "Condemnation Award") shall be made payable to the Association and shall be distributed by the Board of Trustees, on behalf of the Association as herein provided.

3. Complete Taking. In the event the entire Project is taken by power of eminent domain, ownership pursuant hereto shall terminate and the Condemnation Award shall be allocated among and distributed to the Owners and the Owners shall divide the Condemnation Award based upon the relative values of the Units immediately prior to the condemnation. Such distribution shall be made by check payable joint to the respective Owners and their respective Mortgagees, as appropriate.

4. Partial Taking. In the event less than the entire Project is taken by power of eminent domain, the following shall occur:

A. Allocation of Award. As soon as practicable, the Board of Trustees shall, on behalf of the Association, reasonably and in good faith, apportion the Condemnation Award between compensation, severance damages or other proceeds and shall allocate such apportioned amounts and pay the same to the Owners as follows:

(i) The total amount apportioned to taking of or injury to the Common Areas shall be located among and distributed to all Owners (including Owners whose entire Units have been taken).

(ii) The total amount apportioned to severance damages shall be allocated among and distributed equally to the Owners of those Units that have not been taken.

(iii) The respective amounts apportioned to the taking of or injury to a particular Unit shall be allocated and distributed to the Owner of such Unit.

(iv) The total amount apportioned to consequential damages and any other taking or injuries shall be allocated and distributed as the Association determines to be equitable under the circumstances;

(v) If apportionment or allocation is already established by negotiation, judicial decree, statute or otherwise, the Association shall employ such apportionment and allocation to the extent it is relevant and applicable;

(vi) Distribution of allocated proceeds shall be made by check payable jointly to individual owners and their respective Mortgagees, as their interests may appear; and

(vii) No provision of this Article VIII or any other provision of this Declaration, the Articles or the Bylaws shall entitle the Owner of a Unit or other party to priority over any First Mortgagee holding such Unit with respect to the distribution to such Unit of the proceeds of any award, settlement or proceeds from any eminent domain or condemnation proceeding.

B. Continuation and Reorganization. If less than the entire Project is taken by power of eminent domain, ownership pursuant hereto shall not terminate but shall continue. In such event the Project

shall be reorganized as follows:

(i) If any partial taking results in the taking of an entire Unit, then the Owner thereof shall cease to be a member of the Association and all voting rights shall terminate;

(ii) If any partial taking results in the taking of a portion of a Unit, the voting rights appertaining to such Unit shall continue.

(iii) If any partial taking results in the taking of a portion of a Unit and if there is a determination made by the Board of Trustees, after duly considering any recommendations, proposals or other input from the Owners, that such taking makes it impractical to use the remaining portion of such Unit, then all voting rights terminate and the remaining portion of such Unit shall thenceforth be part of the Common Areas;

(iv) The Board of Trustees, after duly considering any recommendations, proposals or other input from the Owners, shall have the duty and authority to make all determinations and to take all actions necessary or appropriate to effectuate reorganization of the Project under the provisions of this Section VIII, 4 B; provided, however, that if any such determination shall have been made or such action taken by judicial decree, the Board of Trustees shall defer thereto and proceed in accordance therewith.

C. Repair and Reconstruction. Any repair and reconstruction necessitated by condemnation shall be governed by the provisions specified in Article VII hereof for cases of Damage or Destruction; provided, however, that the provisions of said article dealing with sufficiency or insufficiency of insurance proceeds shall not be applicable.

ARTICLE IX. TERMINATION

1. Required Vote. Except as otherwise provided in Article VII and Article VIII, the Project may be terminated only by agreement of Owners entitled to vote at least two-thirds (2/3) of the votes attributable to all Units.

2. Termination Agreement. An agreement to terminate shall be evidenced by the execution or ratification of a termination agreement, in the same manner as a deed, by the requisite number of Owners. Such an agreement to terminate shall also be approved by Eligible Mortgagees who represent at least two-thirds (2/3) of the votes of Units subject to First Mortgages held by Eligible Mortgagees. Such approval (and any other approval related to an amendment to this Declaration) shall be deemed given when an Eligible Mortgagee fails to submit a response within thirty (30) days after it receives proper notice of the proposal, provided the notice was delivered by certified or registered mail, with a "return receipt" requested. The termination agreement shall specify a date after which the agreement will be void unless it is recorded before that date. A termination agreement, including all ratifications of such termination agreement, shall be recorded in Salt Lake County, Utah and is effective only on recordation.

3. Sale of Project. A termination agreement may provide that the entire Project shall be sold following termination. If, pursuant to the agreement, any real estate in the Project is to be sold following termination, the termination agreement shall set forth the minimum terms of the sale.

4. Association Duties. The Association, on behalf of the Owners, may contract for the sale of real estate in the Project, but the contract is not binding on the Owners until approved pursuant to Sections 1 and 2. If any real estate in the Project is to be sold following termination, title to that real estate on termination vests in the Association as Trustee for all Owners. Thereafter, the Association has all powers necessary and appropriate to effect the sale. Until the sale has been concluded and the proceeds of the sale distributed, the Association continues in existence with all powers it had before termination. Proceeds of the sale shall be distributed to Owners and Mortgagees as their interests may appear, based on the relative value of each Unit. Unless otherwise specified in the termination agreement, as long as the Association holds title to the real estate, each Owner and their successors in

interest have an exclusive right to occupancy of the portion of the real estate that formerly constituted their Unit in accordance with the terms of this Declaration. During the period of that occupancy right, each Owner and their successors in interest remain liable for all assessments and other obligations imposed on Owners by this Declaration.

5. Following termination of the Project, the proceeds of any sale of real estate, together with the assets of the Association, shall be held by the Association as trustee for Owners and Mortgagees as their interests may appear. Following termination, Mortgagees holding Mortgages on the Units which were recorded before termination may enforce those liens in the same manner as any lienholder.

ARTICLE X. GENERAL USE RESTRICTIONS

1. Rules and Regulations. The Association shall have authority to promulgate and enforce such reasonable rules, regulations and procedures as may be necessary or desirable to aid the Association in carrying out any of its functions or to insure that the Property is maintained and used in a manner consistent with the interest of the Owners.

2. Use of Common Areas. The Common Areas shall be used only in a manner consistent with their community nature and with the rules regulations and use restrictions applicable to Units. No admission fees, charges for use, leases, or other income generating arrangement of any type shall be employed or entered into with respect to any portion of the Common Area.

3. Use of Units. Each Unit shall be used only as is consistent with zoning regulations of Draper City, provided that such use does not violate the provisions of Section 10 of this Article X. No Unit shall be used, occupied, or altered in violation of law, zoning or any other ordinance or resolution, so as to jeopardize the structural integrity of any other Unit, so as to create a nuisance or interfere with the rights of any Owners. Draper City code requires a certain number of parking stalls for each commercial development. The number of stalls required is based on usage and size. Parking in the project is provided in the common areas. The interior of the units shall be built out and used only in such a manner that the parking requirements of Draper City shall be complied with. To facilitate this, transfer of title to each unit shall include "Parking Based Development Rights" specifying the maximum number of Draper City required parking stalls that the unit shall be permitted to require based on its size and usage including interior improvements. No Unit may be used for any purpose which would render the property uninsurable.

Storage Restriction: No Unit may be used for storage that exceeds the height of twelve feet (12') above floor level. The only exception to this restriction shall be by the owner of the unit obtaining and presenting to the Association written permission from Draper City officials, stating that Draper City approves the proposed storage. Any additional fire suppression measures required to obtain said permissions shall be at the expense of the Unit owner.

Unless consented to in writing by the Board, in its sole and absolute discretion, no Units shall be used for:

- (i) The sales or repair of motor vehicles;
- (ii) A movie theater or restaurant;
- (iii) A bowling alley, miniature golf course, video arcade, video or music rental or sales (retail);
- (iv) The sale, distribution, rental or viewing of sexually explicit materials or sexually explicit performances;
- (v) The sale of paraphernalia related to illegal drugs;
- (vi) Escort services;
- (vii) Any business establishment utilizing an outdoor speaker that produces in excess of 40 DBA's as can be heard by a person occupying the Units or any business

establishment utilizing an outdoor speaker during the hours of midnight to 8:00 a.m. on weekdays and 1:00 a.m. on weekends;

- (viii) The storage or sale of petroleum products or other Hazardous materials (as defined herein);
- (ix) Any business establishment creating noxious or harmful odors; or
- (x) Any business which utilizes more than ten (10) on-site employees per Unit.

4. Exception for Declarant. Notwithstanding the restrictions contained in this Article X for the five (5) year period following the date on which this Declaration is filed for record in the office of the County Recorder of Salt Lake County, Utah, Declarant shall have the right to use any Unit owned by it, and any part of the Common Areas reasonably necessary or appropriate, in furtherance of any activities designed to accomplish or facilitate improvement, sale or lease of all Units owned by Declarant. Declarant shall also have the right to maintain a reasonable number of promotional, advertising, or directional signs, banners, or similar devices at any place or places on the Property. Declarant shall have the right from time to time to locate or relocate any of its signs, banners or similar devices.

5. Leases. Any lease agreement between an Owner and a lessee respecting a Unit shall be subject in all respects to the provisions of this Declaration, the Articles and Bylaws, and any failure by the lessee to comply with the terms of such documents shall be a default under the lease. All such lease agreements shall be in writing. Other than the foregoing, there is no restriction on the right of any Owner to lease his Unit. An Owner shall be responsible and liable for any damage to the Project caused by its tenant.

6. Utility Easements. Easements for installation and maintenance of utilities are reserved. Within these easements, no structure, planting or other material shall be placed or permitted to remain which may damage or interfere with the installation and maintenance of utilities. Easements for the installation, repair and maintenance of utilities are also reserved within each Unit. It is contemplated that telephone, gas, water, fire sprinkling systems, electricity and other utilities may originate in one Unit and terminate in another Unit. A right of access to all such utilities is reserved to the Association and Owners and to all utility suppliers. In the event an Owner fails to maintain enough heat in his or her Unit to keep water pipes from freezing or any other utility lines from functioning property, such right of maintenance shall include the right of the Association to heat such Unit, and the cost thereof shall become a lien against such Unit pursuant to Article V, Section 12.

7. Nuisances. No rubbish or debris of any kind shall be placed or permitted to accumulate upon the Property, and no odors shall be permitted to arise therefrom so as to render any part of the Property unsanitary or unsightly or which would be offensive or detrimental to any other part of the Property or to the occupants thereof. No noise, odors or other nuisance shall be permitted to exist or operate upon any part of the Property or from within any Unit so as to be offensive or detrimental to any other part of the Property, or to the occupants thereof. Without limiting the generality of any of the foregoing, no exterior speakers, horns, whistles, bells or other sound devices (other than security devices used exclusively for security purposes) shall be located, used or placed on the Property without the prior written approval of the Board. An activity shall be deemed to constitute a nuisance only upon the 2/3 affirmative vote of the Owners.

8. Unsightly Articles. No unsightly articles or personal property shall be permitted to remain in or near a Unit or the Common Areas so as to be visible from any other Unit or the Common Areas. Without limiting the generality of the Foregoing, the Common Areas shall not be used for (1) non-emergency vehicular repair; (2) recreational vehicle storage (including boats, campers, RVs, snowmobiles or trailers); (3) vehicle parking for longer than seventy-two (72) consecutive hours; (4) parking any vehicle not in running order; or (5) leaving any other articles of personal property sitting around. The Association shall have the right to tow away or remove any of the above which are in violation of this Section 12, as determined by the Association in its reasonable discretion, and the cost of such removal shall be assessed against the Owner responsible for such violation and such assessment shall be secured by a lien on such Owner's Unit in favor of the Association in accordance with Article V, Section 6. Furthermore, in order to maintain a professional appearance, owners shall install window coverings on all windows looking directly into unfinished warehouse/storage areas prior to using such areas for storage.

9. Temporary and Other Structures. No structures of a temporary nature, trailer, tent shack, shed, garage, barn or other outbuildings shall be allowed on the Property either temporarily or permanently at any time.

10. Trash Removal. No trash or refuse containers of any kind shall be permitted to remain on the Common Areas without the prior written consent of the Association. Each Owner shall utilize the common trash container(s) provided for and assessed by the Association located on the Common Areas or Limited Common Areas. If any Owner shall abuse the common trash containers provided in the Common Areas, the Association shall be empowered to (i) require such Owner to maintain at his own expense a separate garbage removal system in an area designated by the Association, or (ii) charge such Owner such additional amount for garbage removal as the Association deems necessary or proper to defray the added cost of garbage removal resulting from such abuse. The term "abuse" as used herein shall mean any overuse of the garbage removal system or the dumping of anything prohibited (or resulting in an increased charge) by the garbage removal service in the judgment of the Association.

11. No Further Subdividing. No Unit or Common Areas may be further subdivided, nor may any easement or other interest therein less than the whole be conveyed by the Owner thereof without the prior written approval of the Association; provided, however, that nothing herein shall be deemed to prevent or require the approval of the Association for the transfer or sale of any Unit to more than one person to be held by them as tenants in common, joint tenants, or otherwise.

12. Signs. The following rules shall apply to signs:

A. As stated in Paragraph 4 of Article X, for five (5) years following the date on which this Declaration is filed for record in the office of the County Recorder of Salt Lake County, Utah, Declarant shall have the right to maintain a reasonable number of promotional, advertising, and directional signs, banners, or similar devices at any place or places on the Property to aid in selling or leasing any Unit owned by Declarant.

B. Unit owners have the right to advertise their Unit for sale or lease by placing a sign inside of their Unit provided (1) the sign does not exceed 2 ft. x 3 ft.; and (2) the sign does not damage the Property.

C. Each Unit may have signage ("Unit Business Sign") for use in identification and advertising purpose. Such signage shall be only as approved in writing by the Trustees or as stated in the Bylaws. Each Unit Business Sign shall constitute part of the Unit and shall be maintained by the Owner. The size and location of each Unit Business Sign shall not be changed without an approval of the Association. The design and content of each Unit Business Sign shall not be changed without the written approval of the Board, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

D. No other signs of any kind shall be displayed on the exterior of the building or on the common areas without approval of all Owners. Decals and signs of any other kind attached to inside of glass are not permitted without the written consent of the Board.

13. No Hazardous Activities. No activities shall be conducted on the property, and no improvements shall be constructed on the Property which are or might be unsafe or hazardous to any person or property.

14. No Hazardous Materials. Each Owner shall not cause or permit any Hazardous Substance to be used, stored, generated or disposed of on or in such Owner's Unit. If any Hazardous Substance is used, stored, generated or disposed of on or in any Owner's Unit, or if an Owner's Unit becomes contaminated in any manner by such Owner (or its lessee), such Owner shall indemnify and hold harmless all other Owners from any and all claims, damages, fines, judgments, penalties, costs, liabilities, or losses including, without limitation, a decrease in the value of the non-contaminated Units, damages caused by loss or restriction of usable space, or any damages caused by adverse impact on the marketing of the non-contaminated Units, and any and all sums paid for settlement of claims, attorney's fees, consultant and expert fees.

As used herein, the term "Hazardous Substance" shall mean any pollutants, contaminants, chemicals, waste and any toxic, infectious, carcinogenic, reactive, corrosive, ignitable or flammable chemical or chemical compound or hazardous substance, material or waste, whether solid, liquid or gas, including any quantity of asbestos

in any form, urea, formaldehyde, PCB's, radon gas, crude oil or any fraction thereof, all forms of natural gas, petroleum products or byproducts or derivatives, radio-active substance, waste waters, sludges, slag and any other substance, material or waste that is subject to regulation, control or remediation under any Environmental Laws.

As used herein, "**Environmental Laws**" shall mean all local, state and federal laws and regulations which regulate or relate to the protection, clean-up and restoration of the environment; the use, treatment, storage, transportation, generation, manufacture, processing, distribution, handling or disposal of, or emission, discharge or other release or threatened release of Hazardous Substance or otherwise dangerous substances, wastes, pollution or materials and shall include the Resource Conservation & Recovery Act, Clean Water Act, Safe Drinking Water Act, Atomic Energy Act, Occupational Safety and Health Act, Toxic Substances Control Act, Clean Air Act, Oil Pollution Act of 1990, Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation and Liability Act and the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act.

15. **Insurance.** If any activity or materials stored or used on the property result in an increase in the insurance premium for the Property, the Owner responsible must pay the increase in the premium, due at the time the premium is due. The cost of such increase shall be assessed against the Owner responsible therefor, and such assessment shall be secured by a lien on such Owner's Unit in favor of the Association in accordance with Article V, Section 6.

16. **Repair of Buildings.** No improvement upon the Property shall be permitted to fall into disrepair, and each such improvement shall at all times be kept in good condition and repair and adequately painted or otherwise finished by the Owner thereof or the Association as applicable.

17. **Improvements and Alterations.** There shall be no excavation, construction or alteration which in any way alters the exterior appearance or structural integrity of any improvement within the Property nor removal of any Unit or other improvement within the Property (other than repairs or rebuilding) without the prior written approval of all Owners.

18. **Roof-top Antennas.** No television, ham radio, citizens band or radio antenna, satellite receiving or other similar electronic receiving or sending device shall be permitted upon the rooftop or side of any unit or elsewhere if exposed to view from any other Unit without written permission from the Trustees. In no case will any such receiving or sending antenna or other device be allowed to interfere with the peace and quiet enjoyment of any neighboring Unit Owner's premises or equipment. Provided, however, Declarant and the Association reserve the right and option to install cable service lines and antennas as needed throughout the Project in connection with its development.

19. **General Obligations.** Each Owner shall enjoy and be subject to all rights and duties assigned to Owners pursuant to this Declaration. With respect to unsold Units, the Declarant shall enjoy the same rights and assumes the same duties with respect to each unsold Unit.

20. **Approval by Board of Trustees Required.** No Improvements of any kind, will be made in any Unit without the prior written approval of the Board. Approval of the Board will be sought in the following manner:

A. **Plans Submitted.** Two complete sets of the plans for the construction of any Improvements must be submitted to the Board for review. The plans must be in sufficient detail to show the locations, sizes, and proposed uses for the entire Unit.

B. **Review Fee.** The applicant will pay a review fee (the "Review Fee") to the Declarant, or when Declarant is no longer an Owner or Trustee in the Condominium, to a member of the Board in an amount necessary to cover the cost of review and administration of the program in an amount to be established from time to time by the Board. The initial Review Fee shall be \$100.00.

C. **Review.** Within thirty (30) days from receipt of a complete submission, including the payment of the Review Fee, the Board will review the plans and make an initial determination whether or not the plans comply with the conditions imposed by the Declaration. If they do not, the plans will be rejected. If they are in compliance, the Board will approve the plans. The Board may also approve the plans subject to specific modifications or conditions. Owners may desire to submit preliminary plans for

review. The Board will review preliminary plans, and make its comments known to the Owner; provided, however, that no preliminary approval is to be considered a final approval, and no final approval will be granted on less than a complete submission. Upon approval, the Board and the Owner will each sign a copy of the plans, one of which shall be left with the Board. No construction that is not in strict compliance with the approved plans will be permitted. Any and all decisions, approvals, reviews and actions of the Board required or permitted under this Declaration may be made by a simple majority of the members of the Board.

D. Failure to Act. If the Board has not approved or rejected any submission within forty-five (45) days after submission of complete plans, the submission is deemed to have been disapproved. If the plans are disapproved as a result of the Board's failure to act, then the applicant may send, by certified mail, return receipt requested, notice to any member of the Board that if the plans are not either approved or disapproved, as submitted, within fifteen (15) days from the date the notice is mailed, then the plans will be deemed to be approved. If within such fifteen (15) day period, the Board fails to respond to the notice by either approving or disapproving the plans, then the plans will be deemed to have been approved. Notwithstanding the Board's failure to respond to any submission, Building and/or Improvements may not, in any way, violate any conditions imposed by this Declaration, and any such deemed approval shall in all respects remain subject to the conditions of this Declaration.

21. General Design Review. The Board will use its best efforts to provide a consistent pattern of development, and consistent application of standards of this Declaration.

22. Declarant and Committee not Liable. The Declarant and the Board and its members shall not be liable for any damages to the applicant or to the Owners of any Units Board's actions, inactions, or approval or disapproval of any set of plans submitted to the Board for review. The Owners shall have no claim against the Declarant or Board as a result of the performance or failure to perform the duties created by this Declaration. Each Owner has an equal duty and right to enforce these covenants against every other Owner, and may seek independent redress if it believes the Board has acted improperly.

23. Limitations on Review. The Board's review is limited to those matters expressly granted in this Declaration. Other than Parking, the Board shall have no authority over the enforcement of building codes, zoning ordinances, or other statutes, laws or ordinances affecting the development or improvement of real property and shall have no liability to any Owner whose plans were approved in a manner that included any such violation. Corrections or changes in plans to bring them into conformity with applicable codes must be approved by the Board prior to construction.

24. Penalty for Failure to File Plans with Board. The Architectural Committee is authorized, but not required, to retain legal counsel and to instigate legal proceedings against any Owner, Builder, contractor, or any other Person who proceeds with construction in any Unit in the Subdivision without first applying for and receiving the approval of the Board or its designated professional reviewer. The Board may give ten (10) days written notice of such failure to file plans and then may proceed with any and all legal remedies. The Board is authorized to assess all reasonable legal and associated costs of obtaining compliance against the Unit and/or Owner. The Board may file a notice of non compliance and/or lien for the costs involved against the Unit and may take any and all action deemed appropriate to enforce this provision of the Declaration, including foreclosure of the lien. Primary responsibility for enforcement of this Declaration lies with the individual Owners.

ARTICLE XI. MORTGAGEE PROTECTION

1. Notice of Action. Upon written request made to the Association by a First Mortgagee, or an insurer or governmental guarantor of a First Mortgage, which written request shall identify the name and address of such First Mortgagee, insurer or governmental guarantor and Unit number or address, any such First Mortgage, insurer or governmental guarantor shall be entitled to timely written notice of:

A. Any condemnation loss or any casualty loss which affects a material portion of the Project or any Unit on which there is a First Mortgage held, insured or guaranteed by such First Mortgagee, insurer or governmental guarantor;

B. Any delinquency in the payment of assessments or charges owed by an Owner, whose Unit is subject to a First Mortgage held, insured or guaranteed by such First Mortgagee, insurer or governmental guarantor, which default remains uncured for a period of sixty (60) days;

C. Any lapse, cancellation or material modification of any insurance policy or fidelity bond maintained by the Association, and

D. Any proposed action which would require the consent of a specified percentage of Eligible Mortgagees as specified in Section 2 below or elsewhere herein.

2. Matters Requiring Prior Eligible Mortgagee Approval. Except as provided elsewhere in this Declaration, the prior written consent of Owners entitled to vote at least two-thirds (2/3) of the votes of the Units in the Association (unless pursuant to a specific provision of this Declaration the consent of Owners entitled to vote a greater percentage of the votes in the Association is required, in which case such specific provisions shall control) and Eligible Mortgagees holding First Mortgages on Units having at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the votes of the Units subject to First Mortgages held by Eligible Mortgagees shall be required to:

A. Abandon or terminate the legal status of the Project after substantial destruction or condemnation occurs.

B. Add or amend any material provision of the Declaration, Articles, Bylaws or Plat, which establishes, provides for, governs or regulates any of the following (an addition or amendment to such documents shall not be considered material if it is for the purpose of correcting technical errors or for clarification only):

- (i) voting rights
- (ii) increases in assessments that raise the previously assessed amount by more than 25% assessment liens, or the priority of assessment liens;
- (iii) reductions in reserves for maintenance, repair, and replacement of Common Areas;
- (iv) responsibility for maintenance and repairs;
- (v) reallocation of interests in the Common Areas, or rights to their use;
- (vi) redefinition of any Unit boundaries;
- (vi) convertibility of Units into Common Areas or vice versa;
- (viii) expansion or contraction of the Project, or the addition, annexation, or withdrawal of property to or from the Project;
- (ix) hazard or fidelity insurance requirements;
- (x) imposition of any restrictions on the leasing of Units;
- (xi) imposition of any restrictions on Owner's right to sell or transfer his or her Unit;
- (xii) a decision by the Association to establish self-management if professional management had been required previously by the Declaration or by an Eligible Mortgagee.

(xiii) restoration or repair of the Project (after damage or partial condemnation) in a manner other than that specified in the Declaration; or

(xiv) any provisions that expressly benefit Mortgagees, insurers or guarantors.

Any Mortgagee, Insurer or governmental guarantor who receives a written request from the Association to approve additions or amendments to the constituent documents and who fails to deliver or post to the Association a negative response within thirty (30) days shall be deemed to have approved such request, provided the written request was delivered by certified or registered mail, with a "return receipt" requested.

3. Availability of Project Documents and Financial Statements. The Association shall maintain and have current copies of the Declaration, Articles, Bylaws, and other rules concerning the Project as well as its own books, records, and financial statements available for inspection by Owners or by holders, insurers, and guarantors of First Mortgages that are secured by Units in the Project. Generally, these documents shall be available during normal business hours.

The Association shall make an audited financial statement for the preceding fiscal year (if the Project has been established for a full fiscal year) available to the holder, insurer, or guarantor of any First Mortgage on submission of a written request for it. The audited financial statement shall be made available within 120 days of the Association's fiscal year end.

4. Subordination of Lien. The lien or claim against a Unit for unpaid assessments or charges levied by the Association pursuant to this Declaration shall be subordinate to the First Mortgage affecting such Unit if the First Mortgage was recorded before the delinquent assessment was due, and the First Mortgage thereunder which comes into possession of or which obtains title to the Unit shall take the same free of such lien or claim for unpaid assessment or charges, but only to the extent of assessments or charges which accrue prior to foreclosure of the First Mortgage, exercise of a power of sale available thereunder, or taking of a deed or assignment in lieu of foreclosure. No assessment, charge, lien, or claim which is described in the preceding sentence as being subordinate to a First Mortgage or as not to burden a First Mortgagee which comes into possession or which obtains title shall be collected or enforced by the Association from or against a First Mortgagee, a successor in title to a First Mortgagee, or the Unit affected or previously affected by the First Mortgage concerned.

5. Payment of Taxes. In the event any taxes or other charges which may or have become a lien on the Common Areas are not timely paid, or in the event the required hazard insurance described in paragraph A of Section 4 of Article VI lapses, is not maintained, or the premiums therefore are not paid when due, any Mortgagee or any combination of Mortgagees may jointly or singly, pay such taxes or premiums or secure such insurance. Any Mortgagee which expends funds for any of such purposes shall be entitled to immediate reimbursement therefor from the Association.

6. Priority. No provision of this Declaration or the articles gives or may give an Owner or any other party priority over any rights of Mortgagees pursuant to their respective Mortgages in the case of a distribution to Owners of insurance proceeds or condemnation awards for loss to or taking of all or any part of the Units or the Common Areas.

ARTICLE XII. OPTION TO EXPAND

1. Option To Expand. It is anticipated that additions to the Project may be developed in a series of phases. Accordingly, Declarant (or its assigns) hereby reserves, pursuant to Section 57-8-13.6 of the Condominium Act, the option to expand the Project (the "Option to Expand") upon the terms and provisions set forth in this Section without the prior consent of the Owners or the Association. The Option to Expand must be exercised by Declarant (or its assigns) within seven (7) years after recordation of this Declaration. The terms and conditions of the Option to Expand shall be as follows:

A. Legal Description. Subject to the power granted Declarant in Section 2(C) below, the real property subject to the Option to Expand consists of the real property sometimes hereinafter referred to

as the "Additional Land", being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the westerly highway right-of-way and no access line of I-15, which point is North 89°35'48" West 161.24 feet (record North 89°35'48" West 155.58 feet) and North 00°12'37" East 567.86 feet (record North 00°12'37" East 569.03 feet) from the East quarter corner of Section 1, Township 4 South, Range 1 West, Salt Lake Base and Meridian and running along said right-of-way and no access line the following six (6) courses: 1) South 10°31'29" East 42.86 feet; 2) South 08°10'46" East 49.39 feet; 3) South 06°29'15" East 152.60 feet; 4) South 05°55'01" East 304.21 feet; 5) South 04°30'39" East 51.93 feet; and 6) South 00°19'59" East 296.70 feet to the Northeasterly highway right-of-way and no access line of the West 13800 South access road; thence Northwesterly along the arc of a 446.11 foot radius curve to the left (center bears South 80°41'16" West) through a central angle of 78°43'44" a distance of 612.99 feet; thence South 89°52'20" West 660.81 feet; thence North 00°07'40" West 78.23 feet; thence North 89°52'20" West 41.00 feet; thence South 00°07'40" East 78.41 feet; thence South 89°52'20" West 375.52 feet; more or less to the Easterly right-of-way line of the Jordan and Salt Lake Canal; thence North 25°00'00" East 330.31 feet; thence South 89°55'30" East 1005.60 feet; thence North 224.41 feet; thence East 287.85 feet to the point of beginning.

Less and Excepting the parcel which constitutes the current condominium description.

B. Order of Exercise. Subject to the provisions of Section 2(C) below, the Option to Expand may be exercised at different times as to the Additional Land described in Section 2(A) and in any order elected by the Declarant. No assurance is made with regard to which phases of the Additional Land, if any, will be added to the Project or the order in which such phases will be so expanded. In the event the Option to Expand is exercised with respect to a portion of the Additional Land, the Option to Expand may subsequently be exercised with respect to any other portion of the Additional Land.

C. Limitations of Expansion. Declarant shall not be restricted in the location of improvements on the Additional Land that may be created on the Additional Land, except as may be required by applicable zoning requirements, ordinances or regulations.

D. Use Restrictions. The Units to be located on the Additional Land shall be subject to the same uses as provided in this Declaration.

E. Use of Common Areas. Each Owner of a Unit constructed on any phase of the Additional Land shall have an unrestricted right of ingress and egress to and from its Unit over and across all Common Areas of the Property. Each Owner of a Unit constructed on any phase of the Additional Land shall have the non-exclusive right to use the Common Areas of the Property. Each Owner of a Unit constructed on any phase of the Additional Land shall have the exclusive right to use and enjoy any Limited Common Areas that may be designated for exclusive use by such owner.

F. Nature of Improvements. Structures other than buildings containing Units may be erected on the Additional Land. Further improvements may be made to the Additional Land including recreational facilities, parking areas, walkways and landscaping of the Common Areas contained therein. All Units and improvements shall be generally consistent with the existing Units and improvements within the Project. Declarant reserves the right to add additional Limited Common Areas to the Additional Land without limitation.

G. Substantial Completion. All Units and other improvements constructed on and made to the Additional Land shall be substantially completed prior to adding such Units and improvements to the

Project.

H. Documentation to Convert. In order to add all or any portion of the Additional Land to the Project, the Declarant (or its assigns) shall:

i. Record, with regard to the Additional Land or any portion thereof that is being added to the Project as Units, Common Areas or Limited Common Areas, a Supplemental Condominium Plan ("**Supplemental Condominium Plan**") showing the location and dimensions of the vertical and horizontal boundaries of each Unit, Common Areas or Limited Common Areas, if any, formed out of the Additional Land or a portion thereof, and assigning any Limited Common Areas which are to be appurtenant to such Unit. Each such Supplemental Condominium Plan shall be certified as to its accuracy and compliance with the requirements of the Condominium Act by the engineer or land surveyor who prepared or supervised the preparation of it; and

ii. Record simultaneously with each Supplemental Condominium Plan an amendment to this Declaration ("**Amendment**") describing the addition. Each such Amendment shall assign a Unit number to each Unit, if any, formed out of the Additional Land or a portion thereof and shall reallocate to each Unit, on the basis provided for in this Declaration, votes appurtenant to each Unit, the apportionment of Common Expenses and the percentage of undivided interest in the Common Areas appertaining to all Units following such addition. Except as otherwise provided by the Condominium Act, each such Amendment or Supplemental Condominium Plan shall also describe the Limited Common Areas, if any, formed out of the Additional Land or a portion thereof, showing or designating the Unit or Units to which each is assigned.

The ownership interest in the Common Areas for all Units in the Project and the apportionment of Common Expenses shall change at the time Declarant records an Amendment and a Supplemental Condominium Plan reflecting Declarant's exercise of the Option to Expand. It is contemplated that there may be multiple amendments filed by Declarant and such amendments and supplements are hereby expressly authorized. Declarant shall have the right to adjust the resulting ownership interests of all Units in the Common Areas of the Project as may be necessary to assure that the total ownership interest equals 100% as required by the Condominium Act.

I. Title to Units. Each Owner, by execution of a contract or deed or the acceptance of a deed to a Unit in the Project, shall be deemed to have consented to all provisions of this Article XII, including the procedure for adjustment of Unit ownership interests. After the filing for record of any Amendment Exhibit "A" to this Declaration and the Supplemental Condominium Plan reflecting Declarant's exercise of the Option to Expand, or any part thereof, legal and equitable title to each Unit thereby created within the Additional Land including its appurtenant ownership interest in the Common Areas shall have any claim or title to or interest in such Unit or the appurtenant ownership interest in the Common Areas.

J. Conveyance of Additional Land. Declarant shall have the right to convey or otherwise transfer its interest in the Additional Land or any portion thereof, and such conveyance or transfer shall not terminate this Option to Expand with respect to any portion of the Additional Land, and the grantee of any portion of the Additional Land shall have the same option and rights as Declarant hereunder.

K. Amendment. No provision of this Article XII shall be amended without the prior written consent of Declarant or its successor in interest, so long as Declarant or its successor in interest either owns or has the right to acquire or construct any Units in the Project.

ARTICLE XIII. MISCELLANEOUS

1. Notices. Any notice required or permitted to be given to any Owner under the provisions of this Declaration shall be deemed to have been properly furnished if mailed postage prepaid to the person who appears as an Owner, at the latest address for such person, appearing in the records of the Association at the time of mailing. Additionally the person and address to receive service of process in behalf of the declarant is Calvin McDonald Brubaker, 7067 South Commerce Park Drive, Midvale, UT 84047.

2. Term. This Declaration shall be effective upon the date of recordation hereof and, as amended from time to time, shall continue in full force and effect for a term of forty (40) years from the date this Declaration is recorded. From and after said date, this Declaration, as amended, shall be automatically extended for successive periods of ten (10) years each, unless there is an affirmative vote to terminate this Declaration by seventy-five percent (75%) of the votes of the Members cast at an election held for such purpose or otherwise approved in writing by such Members within six (6) months prior to the expiration of the initial effective period hereof or any ten (10) year extension.

3. Amendment. Except as provided in Article XII and elsewhere in this Declaration, any amendment to this Declaration shall require the affirmative vote or written approval of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the total votes of the Association. Any amendment authorized pursuant to this Section shall be accomplished through the recordation in the office of the Salt Lake County Recorder of an instrument executed by the Association. In such Instrument an officer or Trustee of the Association shall certify that the vote required by this Section for amendment has occurred. Anything in this Article or Declaration to the contrary notwithstanding, Declarant reserves the unilateral right to amend all or any part of this Declaration to such extent and with such language as may be requested by FNMA and to further amend to the extent requested by any other federal, state or local governmental agency which requests such an amendment as a condition precedent to such agency's approval of the Declaration, or by any federally chartered lending institution as a condition precedent to lending funds upon the security of any Unit(s) or any portions thereof. Any such amendment shall be effected by the recordation by Declarant of an amendment duly signed by or on behalf of the authorized officers of Declarant with their signatures acknowledged, specifying the federal, state or local governmental agency or the amendatory language requested by such agency or institution. Recordation of such an amendment shall be deemed conclusive proof of the agency's or institution's request for such an amendment, and such amendment, when recorded, shall be binding upon all of the Project and all persons having an interest therein. It is the desire of Declarant to retain control of the Association and its activities during the anticipated period of planning and development. If any amendment requested pursuant to the provisions of this Section deletes, diminishes, or alters such control, Declarant alone shall have the right to amend this Declaration to restore such control. Within ten (10) years from the date of recording the Declaration, and so long as the Declarant is the Owner of any Unit in the Project, this Declaration may be amended or terminated only with the written approval of the Declarant. The Declarant alone may amend or terminate this Declaration prior to the closing of a sale of any Unit.

4. Rights of Action. The Association and any aggrieved Owner shall have a right of action against Owners who fail to comply with the provisions of the Declaration or the decisions of the Association. Owners shall have a similar right of action against the Association.

5. Declarant's Rights Assignable. The rights of Declarant under this Declaration or in any way relating to the Property may be assigned, whereupon the assignee of Declarant shall have all the rights of Declarant hereunder.

6. Interpretation. The captions, which precede the Articles and Sections of this Declaration, are for convenience only and in no way affect the manner in which any provision hereof is construed. Whenever the context so requires, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, the whole shall include any part thereof, and any gender shall include the other gender. The invalidity or unenforceability of any portion of this Declaration shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remainder thereof. This Declaration shall be liberally construed to effect all of its purposes.

7. Covenants to Run with Land. This Declaration and all of the provisions hereof shall constitute covenants to run with the land or equitable servitudes, as the case may be, and shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of Declarant, all parties who hereafter acquire any interest in a Unit or in the Common Areas, and their respective grantees, transferees, heirs, devisees, personal representatives, successors, and assigns. Each Owner or occupant of a Unit shall comply with, and all interests in all Units or in the Common Areas shall be subject to, the terms of this Declaration and the provisions of any rules, regulations, agreements, instruments and determinations

contemplated by this Declaration. By acquiring any interest in a Unit or in the Common Areas, the party acquiring such interest consents to, and agrees to be bound by, each and every provision of this Declaration.

8. Lists of Owners and Eligible Mortgagees. The Board shall maintain up-to-date records showing: (i) the name of each person who is an Owner, the address of such person, and the Unit which is owned by him; (ii) the name of each person or entity who is an Eligible Mortgagee, the address of such person or entity and the Unit which is encumbered by the Mortgage held by such person or entity; and (iii) the name of each person or entity who is an insurer or governmental guarantor, the address of such person or entity, and the Unit which is encumbered by the Mortgage insured or guaranteed by such person or entity. In the event of any transfer of a fee or undivided fee interest in a Unit, either the transferor or transferee shall furnish the Board with evidence establishing that the transfer has occurred and that the Deed or other instrument accomplishing the transfer is of record in the office of the County Recorder of Salt Lake County, Utah. The Board may for all purposes act and rely on the information concerning Owners and Unit ownership which is thus acquired by it or, at its option, the Board may act and rely on current ownership information respecting any Unit or Units which is obtained from the office of the County Recorder of Salt Lake County, Utah. The address of an Owner shall be deemed to be the address of the Unit owned by such person unless the Board is otherwise advised.

9. Effective Date. This Declaration or any amendment or supplement hereto shall take effect upon its being filed for record in the office of the County Recorder of Salt Lake County, Utah.

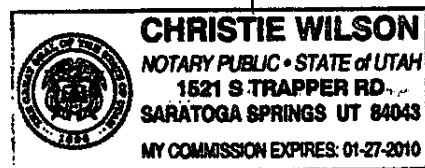

**ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
BANGERTER 15 CONDOMINIUMS
OWNERS ASSOCIATION
A UTAH NONPROFIT CORPORATION**

J. McDonald Brubaker, the undersigned natural person of the age of twenty-one years or more, acting as incorporator of a corporation under the Utah Nonprofit Corporation and Co-Operative Association Act, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation for such nonprofit corporation:

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this nonprofit corporation is BANGERTER 15 CONDOMINIUMS Owners Association, hereinafter referred to as the "Association."

ARTICLE II - DEFINITIONS

Except as otherwise provided herein or as may be required by the context, all terms defined in Article I of the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions of BANGERTER 15 CONDOMINIUMS, hereinafter referred to as the "Declaration," shall have such defined meanings when used in these Articles Of Incorporation.

ARTICLE III - DURATION

The period of its duration is perpetual.

ARTICLE IV - PURPOSES

The Association is organized as a nonprofit corporation and shall be operated exclusively for the purpose of maintaining, operating, and governing BANGERTER 15 CONDOMINIUMS, hereinafter referred to as the "Project," which is located upon the following described real property in the County of Salt Lake, State of Utah:

CONDOMINIUM BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION

Beginning 382.94 feet West and 48.54 feet North from the witness corner monument of the East Quarter of Section 1, Township 4 South, Range 1 West, Salt Lake Base & Meridian
Thence running North 295.79 feet; thence North 89°55'30" West 745.05 feet; Thence South 00°07'40" East 298.34 feet; Thence North 89°52'20" East 33.66 feet; Thence North 00°07'40" West 75.41 feet; Thence South 89°52'20" East 41.00 feet; Thence South 00°07'40" East 72.23 feet; Thence North 89°52'20" East 660.81 feet; Thence South Easterly along the arc of a 446.11 radius curve to the right a distance of 8.93 feet to the point of beginning. (Containing 218,105.5 Square feet, 5.0 Acres more or less)

The Association is organized and shall be operated to perform the functions and provide the services contemplated in the Declaration, which document is to be recorded in the office of the County Recorder of Salt Lake County, State of Utah. No dividend shall be paid and no part of the net income of the Association, if any, shall be distributed to the Members, Trustees, or Officers of the Association, except as otherwise provided herein, in the Declaration, or under Utah law.

ARTICLE V - POWERS

Subject to the purposes declared in Article IV above and any limitations herein expressed, the Association shall have and may exercise each and all of the following powers and privileges:

(a) The power to do any and all things that the Association is authorized or required to do under the Declaration, as the same may from time to time be amended, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the specific power to fix, levy, and collect the charges and assessments provided for in the said Declaration;

(b) The power to purchase, acquire, own, hold, lease, mortgage, sell, and dispose of any and all kinds and character of real, personal, and mixed property (the foregoing particular enumeration in no sense being used by way of exclusion or limitation), and while the owner of any of the foregoing, to exercise all rights, powers and privileges appertaining thereto; and

(c) The power to do any and all things that a non-profit corporation may now or hereafter do under the laws of the State of Utah.

ARTICLE VI - MEMBERSHIP

The Members of the Association shall be all of the record owners of Condominiums in the Project, as such owners are shown on the records of the County Recorder of Salt Lake County, State of Utah. The term record owner shall not include any mortgagee, trustee, or beneficiary under any mortgage, trust deed, or other security instrument by which a condominium or any part thereof is encumbered (unless such mortgagee, trustee, or beneficiary has acquired title for other than security purposes by means of judicial or nonjudicial action, including without limitation, a foreclosure proceeding or any deed or other arrangement in lieu of foreclosure), nor shall it include persons or entities purchasing a Condominium under contract (until such contract is fully performed and legal title conveyed). If record ownership of a Condominium in the Project is jointly held, the Membership appertaining to such Condominium shall also be jointly held. membership in the Association shall be mandatory and not optional. Each membership in the Association shall be appurtenant to and shall not be separated from the Condominium to which it relates. No person or entity other than an owner of a Condominium in the Project may be a Member of the Association.

ARTICLE VII - MEMBERSHIP CERTIFICATES

The Association may issue certificates of Membership, but such certificates shall not be necessary to evidence Membership in the Association. Membership in the Association shall begin immediately and automatically upon becoming a record owner of the Condominium to which such Membership appertains and shall cease immediately and automatically upon an owner ceasing to be

a record owner of such Condominium.

ARTICLE VIII - VOTING RIGHTS

All voting rights of the Association shall be exercised by the Members, each Membership being entitled to the number of votes relating to the Condominium appertaining to such Membership, as set forth in the Declaration. If a Membership is jointly held, any or all holders thereof may attend any meeting of the Members where membership is jointly held by two individuals, such holder must act unanimously to cast the votes relating to their joint membership. Where three or more individuals jointly hold the Membership, such holders shall cast the votes relating to such Membership as the majority of said holders shall agree amongst themselves. Any designation of a proxy to act for joint holders of a Membership must be signed by all such holders. With respect to matters to be voted upon by the Members as provided in the Declaration, the voting requirements and proportions shall be as set forth in the Declaration. Cumulative voting is not permitted.

ARTICLE IX - ASSESSMENTS

Members of the Association shall be subject to assessments by the Association from time to time in accordance with the provisions of the Declaration and shall be liable to the Association for payment of such assessments. Members shall not be individually or personally liable for the debts or obligations of the Association. However, the foregoing in no way relieves the Members of their personal liability on the assessments as such assessments are assessed from time to time against their individual Condominiums.

ARTICLE X - PRINCIPAL OFFICE AND REGISTERED AGENT

The address of the initial principal office of the Association is 7067 South Commerce Park Drive, Salt Lake City, Utah 84047, and the name of the initial registered agent of the Association at such address is J. McDonald Brubaker.

ARTICLE XI - BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Board of Trustees consisting of not fewer than three (3) or more than eight (8) Trustees, as prescribed in the By-Laws. Until such time as the responsibility for electing the Trustees of the Association is turned over to the Members in accordance with Utah law, BANGERTER 15, L.C. , or its successor or assign, shall have the exclusive right to appoint and remove such Trustees. Except for Trustees appointed as herein provided, Trustees must be Members of the Association. The number of Trustees constituting the initial Board of Trustees shall be three (3). The names and addresses of the persons who are to serve on the initial Board of Trustees until the first annual meeting of the Association and until the successors of such Trustees are elected and shall qualify are as follows:

The Board of Trustees may by written contract delegate to a professional management organization or individual such of its managerial duties, responsibilities, functions, and powers as are properly delegable.

ARTICLE XIII - BY-LAWS, RULES, AND REGULATIONS

The Board of Trustees may adopt, amend, repeal, and enforce Bylaws and reasonable rules and regulations governing the operation of the Association and the operation and use of the Project, to the extent that the same are not inconsistent with these Articles of Incorporation or the Declaration.



Pursuant to the provisions of the Utah Nonprofit Corporation And Cooperative Association Act, the Board of Trustees of BANGERTER 15 CONDOMINIUMS Owners Association, a Utah nonprofit corporation, hereby adopts the following Bylaws for such nonprofit corporation.

**ARTICLE I
NAME AND PRINCIPAL OFFICE**

1.01 Name. The name of the nonprofit corporation is BANGERTER 15 CONDOMINIUMS Owners Association, hereinafter referred to as the "Association."

1.02 Offices. The initial principal office of the Association shall be at 7067 South Commerce Park Drive, Salt Lake City, Utah 84047.

**ARTICLE II
DEFINITIONS**

2.01 Definitions. Except as otherwise provided herein or as may be required by the context, all terms defined in Article I of the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions of BANGERTER 15 CONDOMINIUMS, a Utah condominium project, hereinafter referred to as the "Declaration", shall have such defined meanings when used in these Bylaws.

**ARTICLE III
MEMBERS**

3.01 Annual Meetings. The annual meeting of Members shall be held on the second Monday in March of each year at the hour of 9:00 o'clock a.m., beginning with the year following the year in which the Articles of Incorporation are filed, for the purpose of electing Trustees and transacting such other business as may come before the meeting. If the election of Trustees shall not be held on the day designated herein for the annual meeting of the Members, or at any adjournment thereof, the Board of Trustees shall cause the election to be held at a special meeting of the Members to be convened as soon thereafter as may be convenient. The Board of Trustees may from time to time by resolution change the date and time for the annual meeting of the Members.

3.02 Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Members may be called by the Board of Trustees, the President, or upon the written request of Members holding not less than ten percent (10%) of the Total Votes of the Association, such written request to state the purpose or purposes of the meeting and to be delivered to the Board of Trustees or the President.

3.03 Place of Meetings. The Board of Trustees may designate any place in Salt Lake County, State of Utah as the place of meeting for any annual meeting or for any special meeting called by the Board. A waiver of notice signed by all of the Members may designate any place, either within or without the State of Utah, as the place for holding such meeting. If no designation is made, or if a special meeting is otherwise called, the place of the meeting shall be at the principal office of the Association.

3.04 Notice of Meetings. The Board of Trustees shall cause written or printed notice of the time, place, and purposes of all meetings of the Members (whether annual or special) to be delivered, not more than fifty (50) nor less than ten (10) days prior to the meeting, to each Member of record entitled to vote at such meeting. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the U.S. mail addressed to the Member at his registered address, with first-class postage thereon prepaid. Each Member shall register with the Association such Member's current mailing address for purposes of notice hereunder. Such registered address may be changed from time to time by notice in writing to the Association. If no address is registered with the Association, a Member's unit address shall be deemed to be his registered address for purposes of notice hereunder.

3.05 Members of Record. Upon purchasing a condominium in the Project, each owner shall promptly furnish to the Association a certified copy of the recorded instrument by which ownership of such Condominium has been vested in such Owner, which copy shall be maintained in the records of the Association. For the purpose of determining Members entitled to notice of or to vote at any meeting of the members, or any adjournment thereof, the Board of Trustees may designate a record date, which shall not be more than fifty (50) nor less than ten (10) days prior to the meeting, for determining Members entitled to notice of or to vote at any meeting of the Members. If no record date is designated, the date on which notice of the meeting is mailed shall be deemed to be the record date for determining Members entitled to notice of or to vote at the meeting. The persons or entities appearing in the records of the Association on such record date as the owners of record of Condominiums in the Project shall be deemed to be the Members of record entitled to notice of and to vote at the meeting of the Members.

3.06 Quorum. At any meeting of the Members, the presence of Members holding, or holders of proxies entitled to cast, more than fifty percent (50%) of the Total Votes of the Association shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. In the event a quorum is not present at a meeting, the Members present (whether represented in person or by proxy), though less than a quorum, may adjourn the meeting to a later date. At the reconvened meeting, the Members and proxy holders present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

3.07 Proxies. At each meeting of the Members, each Member entitled to vote shall be entitled to vote in person or by proxy; provided, however, that the right to vote by proxy shall exist only where the instrument authorizing such proxy to act shall have been executed by the Member

himself or by his attorney thereunto duly authorized in writing. If a Membership is jointly held, the instrument authorizing a proxy to act must have been executed by all holders of such Membership or their attorneys thereunto duly authorized in writing. Such instrument authorizing a proxy to act shall be delivered at the beginning of the meeting to the Secretary of the Association or to such other officer or person who may be acting as secretary of the meeting. The secretary of the meeting shall enter a record of all such proxies in the minutes of the meeting.

3.08 Votes. With respect to each matter submitted to a vote of the Members, each member entitled to vote at the meeting shall have the right to cast, in person or by proxy, the number of votes appertaining to the condominium of such Member, as shown in the Declaration. The affirmative vote of a majority of the votes entitled to be cast by the Members present or represented by proxy at a meeting at which a quorum was initially present shall be necessary for the adoption of any matter voted on by the Members, unless a greater proportion is required by the Articles of Incorporation, these Bylaws, the Declaration, or Utah law. The election of Trustees shall be by secret ballot. If a membership is jointly held, all or any holders thereof may attend each meeting of the Members, but such holders must act unanimously to cast the votes relating to their joint Membership.

3.09 Waiver of Irregularities. All inaccuracies and irregularities in calls or notices of meetings and in the manner of voting form of proxies, and method of ascertaining Members present shall be deemed waived if no objection thereto is made at the meeting.

3.10 Informal Action by Members. Any action that is required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of the Members may be taken without a meeting, if a consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the Members entitled to vote with respect to the subject matter thereof.

ARTICLE IV BOARD OF TRUSTEES

4.01 General Powers. The property, affairs, and business of the Association shall be managed by its Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees may exercise all of the powers of the Association, whether derived from law or the Articles of Incorporation, except such powers as are by law, by the Articles of Incorporation, by these Bylaws, or by the Declaration vested solely in the Members. The Board of Trustees may by written contract delegate, in whole or in part, to a professional management organization or person such of its duties, responsibilities, factions, and powers as are properly delegable.

4.02 Number, Tenure and Qualifications. The number of Trustees of the Association shall be three (3). The initial Board of Trustees specified in the Articles of Incorporation shall serve until the Declarant turns over to the Members, as provided in the Declaration, the responsibility for electing Trustees. At the first annual meeting of the Members held after the Declarant turns over to the Members responsibility for electing Trustees, the Members shall elect three (3) Trustees to serve for the following respective terms: Two (2) Trustees to serve for terms of two (2) years each; and one (1) Trustee to serve for a term of one (1) year. At each annual meeting thereafter, the Members

shall elect for terms of two (2) years each the appropriate number of Trustees to fill all vacancies created by expiring terms of Trustees. All Trustees, except Trustees appointed by the Declarant, shall be Members of the Association.

4.03 Regular Meetings. The regular annual meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be held without other notice than this Bylaw immediately after, and at the same place as, the annual meeting of the Members. The Board of Trustees may provide by resolution the time and place, within Salt Lake County, State of Utah, for the holding of additional regular meetings without other notice than such resolution.

4.04 Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board of Trustees may be called by or at the request of any Trustee. The person or persons authorized to call special meetings of the Board of Trustees may fix any place, within Salt Lake County, State of Utah, as the place for holding any special meeting of the Board of Trustees called by such person or persons. Notice of any special meeting shall be given at least five (5) days prior thereto by written notice delivered personally, or mailed, to each Trustee at his registered address, or by Telegram. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the U.S. mail so addressed, with first-class postage thereon prepaid. If notice is given by telegram, such notice shall be deemed to have been delivered when the telegram is delivered to the telegraph company. Any Trustee may waive notice of a meeting.

4.05 Quorum and Manner of Acting. A majority of the then authorized number of Trustees shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board of Trustees. The act of a majority of the Trustees present at any meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Trustees. The Trustees shall act only as a Board, and individual Trustees shall have no powers as such.

4.06 Compensation. No Trustee shall receive compensation for any services that he may render to the Association as a Trustee; provided, however, that a Trustee may be reimbursed for expenses incurred in performance of his duties as a Trustee to the extent such expenses are approved by the Board of Trustees and (except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws) may be compensated for services rendered to the Association other than in his capacity as a Trustee.

4.07 Resignation and Removal. A Trustee may resign at any time by delivering a written resignation to either the president or the Board of Trustees. Unless otherwise specified therein, such resignation shall take effect upon delivery. Any Trustee, except a Trustee appointed by the Declarant, may be removed at any time, for or without cause, by the affirmative vote of seventy-five percent (75%) of the Total Votes of the Association at a special meeting of the Members duly called for such purpose.

4.08 Vacancies and Newly Created Trusteeships. If vacancies shall occur in the Board of Trustees by reason of the death, resignation or disqualification of a Trustee (other than a Trustee appointed by Declarant), or if the authorized number of Trustees shall be increased, the Trustees then in office shall continue to act, and such vacancies or newly created Trusteeships shall be filled by a vote of the Trustees then in office, though less than a quorum, in any way approved by such Trustees at the meeting. Any vacancy in the Board of Trustees occurring by reason of removal of a

Trustee by the Members may be filled by election at the meeting at which such Trustee is removed. If vacancies shall occur in the Board of Trustees by reason of death, resignation or removal of a Trustee appointed by the Declarant, such vacancies shall be filled by appointments to be made by the Declarant. Any Trustee elected or appointed hereunder to fill a vacancy shall serve for the unexpired term of his predecessor or for the term of the newly created Trusteeship, as the case may be.

4.09 Informal Action by Trustees. Any action that is required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of the Board of Trustees, may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the Trustees.

ARTICLE V OFFICERS

5.01 Officers. The officers of the Association shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary/Treasurer and such other officers as may from time to time be appointed by the Board of Trustees.

5.02 Election Tenure and Qualifications. The officers of the Association shall be chosen by the Board of Trustees annually at the regular annual meeting of the Board of Trustees. In the event of failure to choose officers at such regular annual meeting of the Board of Trustees, officers may be chosen at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Trustees. Each such officer (whether chosen at a regular annual meeting of the Board of Trustees or otherwise) shall hold his office until the next ensuing regular annual meeting of the Board of Trustees and until his successor shall have been chosen and qualified, or until his death, or until his resignation, disqualification, or removal in the manner provided in these Bylaws, whichever first occurs. Any one person may hold any two or more of such offices, except that the President may not also be the Secretary. No person holding two or more offices shall act in or execute any instrument in the capacity of more than one office. The President, Vice-President., and Secretary/Treasurer shall be and remain Trustees of the Association during the entire term of their respective offices. No other officer need be a Trustee.

5.03 Subordinate Officers. The Board of Trustees may from time to time appoint such other officers or agents as it may deem advisable, each of whom shall have such title, hold office for such period, have such authority, and perform such duties as the Board of Trustees may from time to time determine. The Board of Trustees may from time to time delegate to any officer or agent the power to appoint any such subordinate officers or agents and to prescribe their respective titles, terms of office,, authorities, and duties. Subordinate officers need not be Members or Trustees of the Association.

5.04 Resignation and Removal Any officer may resign at any time by delivering a written resignation to the president or the Board of Trustees. Unless otherwise specified therein, such resignation shall take effect upon delivery. Any officer may be removed by the Board of Trustees at any time, for or without cause.

5.05 Vacancies and Newly Created Offices. If any vacancy shall occur in any office by

reason of death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause, or if a new office shall be created, such vacancies or newly created offices may be filled by the Board of Trustees at any regular or special meeting.

5.06 The President. The President shall preside at meetings of the Board of Trustees and at meetings of the Members. He shall sign on behalf of the Association all conveyances, mortgages, documents, and contracts, and shall do and perform all other acts and things that the Board of Trustees may require of him.

5.07 The Vice President. The Vice-President shall act in the place and stead of the President in the event of the President's absence or inability or refusal to act, and shall exercise and discharge such other duties as may be required of him by the Board of Trustees.

5.08 The Secretary/Treasurer. The Secretary/Treasurer shall keep the minutes of the Association and shall maintain such books and records as these Bylaws, the Declaration, or any resolution of the Board of Trustees may require him to keep. He shall also act in the place and stead of the President in the event of the President's absence or inability or refusal to act. he shall be the custodian of the seal of the Association, if any, and shall affix such seal, if any, to all papers and instruments requiring the same. He shall have the custody and control of the funds of the Association, subject to the action of the Board of Trustees, and shall, when requested by the President to do so, report the state of the finances of the Association at each annual meeting of the Members and at the meeting of the Board of Trustees. He shall perform such other duties as the Board of Trustees may require of him.

5.09 Compensation. No officer shall receive compensation for any services that he may render to the Association as an officer; provided, however, that an officer may be reimbursed for expenses incurred in performance of his duties as an officer to the extent such expenses are approved by the Board of Trustees and (except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws) may be compensated for services rendered to the Association other than in his capacity as an officer.

ARTICLE VI COMMITTEES

6.01 Designation of Committees. The Board of Trustees may from time to time by resolution designate such committees as it may deem appropriate in carrying out its duties, responsibilities, functions, and powers. The membership of each such committee designated hereunder shall include at least one (1) Trustee. No committee member shall receive compensation for services that he may render to the Association as a committee member; provided, however, that a committee member may be reimbursed for expenses incurred in performance of his duties as a committee member to the extent that such expenses are approved by the Board of Trustees and (except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws) may be compensated for services rendered to the Association other than in his capacity as a committee member.

6.02 Proceedings of Committees. Each committee designated hereunder by the Board of Trustees may appoint its own presiding and recording officers and may meet at such places and times and upon such notice as such committee may from time to time determine. Each such

committee shall keep a record of its proceedings and shall regularly report such proceedings to the Board of Trustees.

6.03 Quorum and Manner of Acting. At each meeting of any committee designated hereunder by the Board of Trustees, the presence of members constituting at least a majority of the authorized membership of such committee (but in no event less than two members) shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and the act of a majority of the members present at any meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of such committee. The members of any committee designated by the Board of Trustees hereunder shall act only as a committee, and the individual member thereof shall have no powers as such.

6.04 Resignation and Removal. Any member of any committee designated hereunder by the Board of Trustees may resign at any time by delivering a written resignation to the President, the Board of Trustees, or the presiding officer of the committee of which he is a member. Unless otherwise specified therein, such resignation shall take effect upon delivery. The Board of Trustees may at any time, for or without cause, remove any member of any committee designated by it hereunder.

6.05 Vacancies. if any vacancy shall occur in any committee designated by the Board of Trustees hereunder, due to disqualification, death, resignation, removal, or otherwise, the remaining members shall, until the filling of such vacancy constitute the then total authorized membership of the committee and, provided that two or more members are remaining, may continue to act. Such vacancy may be filled at any meeting of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE VII INDEMNIFICATION

7.01 Indemnification - Third Party Actions. The Association shall indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed action, suit, or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative (other than an action by or in the right of the Association) by reason of the fact that he is or was a Trustee or officer of the Association, or is or was serving at the request of the Association as a director, trustee, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, against expenses (including attorney's fees), judgments, fines, and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by him in connection with such action, suit, or proceeding, if he acted in good faith and in a manner he reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the Association, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his conduct was unlawful. The termination of any action, suit, or proceeding by an adverse judgment, order, settlement, or conviction, or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent, shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner which he reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interest of the Association and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had reasonable cause to believe that his conduct was unlawful.

7.02 Indemnification Association Actions. The Association shall indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed action or suit by or in the right of the Association to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of the fact that he is or was a Trustee or officer of the Association, or is or was serving at the request of the Association as a director, trustee, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise against expenses (including attorney's fees) actually and reasonably incurred by him in connection with the defense or settlement of such action or suit, if he acted in good faith and in a manner he reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the Association and except that no indemnification shall be made in respect of any claim, issue, or matter as to which such person shall have been adjudged to be liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of his duty to the Association, unless and only to the extent that the court in which such action or suit was brought shall determine upon application that, despite the adjudication of liability but in view of all circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnify for such expenses which such court shall deem proper.

7.03 Determinations. To the extent that a person has been successful on the merits or otherwise in defense of any action, suit, or proceeding referred to in Sections 7.01 or 7.02 hereof, or in defense of any claim, issue, or matter therein, he shall be indemnified against expenses (including his attorney fees) actually and reasonably incurred by him in connection therewith. Any other indemnification under Sections 7.01 and 7.02 hereof shall be made by the Association only upon a determination that indemnification of the person is proper in the circumstances because he has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth respectively in Sections 7.01 or 7.02 hereof. Such determination shall be made either (i) by the Board of Trustees by a majority vote of disinterested Trustees or (ii) by independent legal counsel in a written opinion, or (iii) by the Members by the affirmative vote of at least fifty percent (50%) of the Total Votes of the Association at any meeting duly called for such purpose.

7.04 Advances. Expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action, suit, or proceeding as contemplated in this Article may be paid by the Association in advance of the final disposition of such action, suit, or proceeding upon a majority vote of a quorum of the Board of Trustees and upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the person to repay such amount or amounts unless it ultimately be determined that he is entitled to be indemnified by the Association as authorized by this Article or otherwise.

7.05 Scope of Indemnification. The indemnification provided for by this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which those indemnified may be entitled under any provision in the Association's Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, agreements, vote of disinterested Members or Trustees, or otherwise, both as to action in his official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding such office. The indemnification authorized by this Article shall apply to all present and future Trustees, officers, employees, and agents of the Association and shall continue as to such persons who cease to be Trustees, officers, employees, or agents of the Association and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs and personal representatives of all such persons and shall be in addition to all other rights to which such persons may be entitled as a matter of law.

7.06 Insurance. The Association shall purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any

person who was or is a Trustee, officer, employee, or agent of the Association, or who was or is serving at the request of the Association as a trustee, director, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, entity, or enterprise (whether for profit or not for profit), as may be required by the Declaration.

7.07 Payments and Premiums. All indemnification payments made, and all insurance premiums for insurance maintained, pursuant to this Article shall constitute expenses of the Association and shall be paid with funds from the Common Expense Fund referred to in the Declaration.

ARTICLE VIII FISCAL YEAR AND SEAL

8.01 Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Association shall begin on the first day of January each year and end on the 31st day of December next following, except that the first fiscal year shall begin on the date of incorporation.


8.02 Seal. The Board of Trustees may by resolution provide a corporate seal which shall be an approved form and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the Association, the state of incorporation, and the words "Corporate Seal."

ARTICLE IX RULES AND REGULATIONS

9.01 Rules and Regulations. The Board of Trustees may from time to time adopt, amend, repeal, and enforce reasonable rules and regulations governing the use and operation of the Project, to the extent that such rules and regulations are not inconsistent with the rights and duties set forth in the Articles of Incorporation, the Declaration, or these Bylaws. The Members shall be provided with copies of all rules and regulations adopted by the Board of Trustees, and with copies of all amendments and revisions thereof.

ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

10.1 Amendments. Except as otherwise provided by law, by these Articles of Incorporation, by the Declaration, or by these Bylaws, these Bylaws may be amended, altered, or repealed and new bylaws may be made and adopted by the Members upon the affirmative vote of at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the Total votes of the Association; provided, however, that such action shall not be effective unless and until a written instrument setting forth (i) the amended, altered, repealed, or new bylaw, (ii) the number of votes cast in favor of such action, and (iii) the Total Votes of the Association, shall have been executed and verified by the current President of the Association and recorded in the office of the County Recorder of Salt Lake County, State of Utah.
