Certificate. To all to whom these presents shall come greeting:

No. 306. Whereas George Laskus of Weber County, Utah Territory, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said George Laskus, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2d of April 1820, intituled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto, for the South East Quarter, and the fourth half of the South West Quarter of section two in township five, range two west of Salt Lake Meridian in Utah Territory, containing two hundred and forty acres, according to the official plat of the Survey of said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said George Laskus.

Know ye that the United States of America, in Consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said George Laskus, and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said George Laskus and to his heirs, and assigns forever, subject to any valid and accrued water rights for mining, agriculture, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches, and reservoirs, used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized, and acknowledged, by the local customs, laws, and decisions of Courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or ledge, to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted as provided by law.

In testimony whereof, I, Grover Cleveland, President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be thereto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the twenty-third day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and fourteenth.
