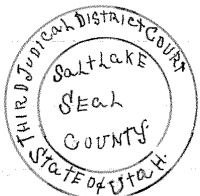

Original Agreement.

This Agreement, made this first day of June, A.D. 1900, between John F. A. Howard and
his wife Prucilla S. Howard, of Sandy, county of Salt Lake, State of Utah, parties of the first
part, and the Sandy Pipe Line Company, a corporation, of the same place, the party of the
second part,

Witnesseth: That the said parties of the first part, in consideration ^{to} of the covenants
and agreements on the part of the party of the second part, hereinafter contained, hereby
covenant and agree that the said second party shall have the right and privilege to lay a
line of drain tile along the line of the ditch that has been heretofore used to convey water
from the Triple Divide, on the Sandy Irrigation Company's ditch, about a mile and a half
east of Sandy, to the old Sandy Reservoir for the purpose of supplying R. Mackintosh and
other persons in Sandy with water. Said ditch to be drained being on the north side of the track
of the Alta branch of the Rio Grande Western Ry., and commenced on the north side of said track
about four rods below the above named Triple Divide, in Section ~~three~~ five (5), Township three
(3), south, Range one (1) east, Salt Lake meridian, and running thence in a generally north-
westerly direction on the north side of said railroad track, varying in distance from said track
from twenty to fifty feet more or less, about forty rods, more or less, to a point about fifty
feet north of the tank of the Sandy Pipe Line Company, said tank being about eighty (80) rods
south and about eighty (80) rods east from the north-west corner of Section five (5), Township,
Range and meridian aforesaid. The tile to be laid either in the bed of said ditch or leaving
the ditch, may be run in a straight line, at points where the course of said ditch may not
be straight, and to be laid at a depth so the top of the tile will not be lower than the bed of
the ditch when properly cleaned for the conveyance of water, or at a depth of about one and
a half to two feet.

In consideration of the covenants and agreements on the part of the parties of
the first part, the party of the second part hereby covenants and agrees that it will pay to the
said first party the sum of Ten Dollars per year for each square inch of water that may be
developed by the laying of said drain tile, and running into the pipes or tank of said second
party at the end of said line of tile.

It is mutually agreed and understood between the parties hereto, that the flow of
water developed by the laying of said drain tile as above specified, shall be measured on the
first day of August of each year, commencing August first, 1900, and payment for the quantity
of water shown thereby to be running into the pipes or tank of the party of the second part, shall
be made within ten days thereafter; provided, that the first payment to be made in August
1900, shall be calculated pro-rata for the months of June and July, 1900, or one-sixth of a year.

It is further mutually agreed and understood that by one inch of water shall be

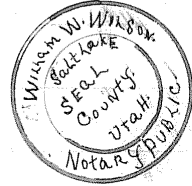
meant, water flowing through a level flume without pressure, one inch deep and one inch wide, and that the time during which this agreement shall be in force is from June 1, 1900 to June 1, 1903.

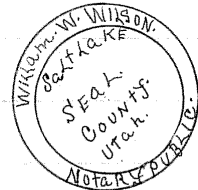

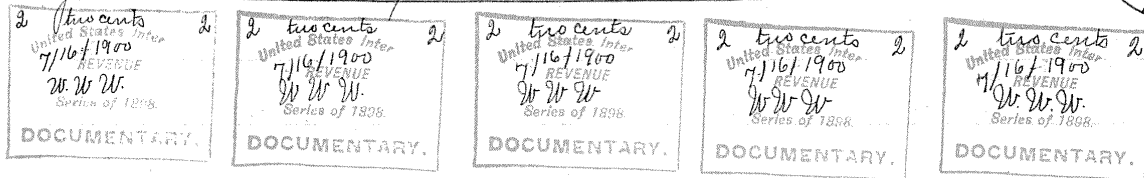
