

O'Clard according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820 entitled An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands, and the acts supplemental thereto, for the North East quarter of the South West quarter of Section five in Township nine South of Range three East of Salt Lake Meridian in Utah Territory, containing forty acres. According to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said Charles E. O'Clard know
 know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Charles O'Clard and to his heirs, and by the said tract above described to have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunitiess, and appurtenances, of whatever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Charles E. O'Clard and to his heirs and assigns forever subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing or other purpose, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law. and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way theron for ditches or canals constructed by the Authority of the United States.  General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been
 purchased by the said George Waterman now know ye that the United States
