A regular meeting of the City Council of Park City, Summit County, Utah, was held on Thursday, April 18, 1985, at the hour of 5:00 p.m. at its regular meeting place in Park City, Utah, at which meeting there were present the following members who constituted a quorum:

After the meeting had been duly called to order and the minutes of the preceding meeting read and approved, the following proceedings, among others, were duly had and taken:

The City Recorder notified the City Council that the Notice of Intention to establish Park City, Utah Prospector Special Improvement District (the "District"), approved by the City Council on the 21st day of February, 1985, had been published in the <u>Park Record</u>, a newspaper of general circulation in Park City, Utah, said notice having been published four times, once during each week for four

consecutive weeks, the last publication being not less than five (5) nor more than twenty (20) days prior to April 4, 1985, and that the affidavit of publishing said Notice of Intention with a copy of the Notice as published was duly filed in his office; also that a copy of such Notice of Intention to create the District has been mailed by United States Main, postage prepaid, to each owner of land affected by or specially benefited by such improvements as said property is described in said Notice insofar as the names and addresses of said owners could be ascertained from the most recent available county assessment books and that it also has been mailed by the United States Mail, postage prepaid, to "Owner" at the street number of each piece of improved property to be affected by said assessment, said Notices having been mailed not later than ten (10) days after the first publication of the Notice of Intention; that the Notice of Intention has been on file in his office during all regular office hours from the 21st day of February, 1985, to the 17th day of April, 1985, for the examination of any interested parties; that said Notice directed that all persons desiring to protest and oppose the creation of the District might appear and file in writing said protests and objections.

The City Recorder then presented a statement stating that written protests against the creation of the District and the making of the proposed improvements therein were received by him in his office by 5:00 p.m. on the 4th day of

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April, 1985. No written protests have been received since that time.

In addition to the written protests, oral comments were received at the public hearing on April 4 and at the continuations of the public hearing on April 11 and April 18. The City Council determined that all interested parties had been given opportunity to comment on or protest against the creation of the District and the improvements to be

constructed within the District. Therefore, the protest hearing as continued from April 4, 1985 was closed.

After consideration of such protests and the statements of those persons heard as aforesaid, it was determined that the total square foot represented by said protest is less than fifty percent (50%) of the total square feet to the assessed within the District and is a percentage insufficient to legally protest creation of the district.

Councilmember William Coleman introduced the following resolution in writing, which was fully discussed, and moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION NO. 95-8

A RESOLUTION TO CREATE PARK CITY, UTAH PROSPECTOR SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT DESCRIBED IN THE NOTICE OF INTENTION CONCERNING THE DISTRICT AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY OFFICIALS TO PROCEED TO MAKE IMPROVEMENTS AS SET FORTH IN THE NOTICE OF INTENTION TO CREATE THE DISTRICT

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of Park City, Summit County, Utah:

Section 1. The City Council of Park City, Summit County, Utah, hereby determines that it will be in the best interest of the Municipality to construct certain improvements within the Municipality. The specific description of the nature of the improvements particularly set out in the Notice of Intention of the City Council which has been published and mailed as required by law.

Section 2. The City Council has heretofore considered each and every protest filed and has heard each and every person who wished to be heard in protest against the creation of the District or making of any of the improvements therein or on any other matter pertinent to the District.

Section 3. The improvements proposed and described in the Notice of Intention to create the District are hereby authorized, nd the District is hereby created.

Section 4. The City Recorder is hereby authorized and directed to file a copy of the Notice of Intention and resolution creating the District as finally approved in the Summit County Recorder's office within five days from the date hereof.

Councilmember Jim Doilney seconded the motion to adopt the foregoing Resolution. The resolution was thereupon put to a vote and unanimously adopted on the following recorded vote:

Thereupon the motion was approved by the Mayor and made a matter of record by the City Recorder.

LEGAL NOTICE

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO CREATE A SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT IN THE PROSPECTOR AREA OF PARK CITY, UTAH IS HEREBY GIVEN BY THE PARK CITY COUNCIL.

The boundary of the Prospector Special Improvement District is Highway 248 on the North, Park City Municipal limits on the East, the north edge of the Union Pacific Rail Road right-of-way on the South, and Bonanza Drive on the West. This area includes the Prospector Park Subdivision, Phases 1, 2, and 3; the Prospector Village Subdivision; and the Prospector Square Subdivision (except Lots 41 and 46).

Assessments will be levied for the following

improvements to be separately assessed in two phases.

PHASE ONE

Throughout the Prospector Special Improvement District all property not landscaped or built upon which may contain all property not landscaped or built upon which may contain exposed mine tailings will be covered with topsoil and seeded. The purposes of the described landscaping are to isolate mine tailings from the residents and visitors of the Prospector Area and Park City, thereby ameliorating any health risk associated with exposure to mine tailings, and health risk associated with exposure to mine tailings, and to improve the appearance of the Prospector Area. Assessments will be levied to pay all costs according to the property owners square footage owned or adjacent which is actually covered and/or seeded. Cost for covering nd seeding as estimated by the City engineer are twenty-seven (27¢) cents per square foot with a total cost of \$820,000 for the Special Improvement District.

PHASE TWO

In the area known as the Prospector Square Planned Unit Development and belonging to the Prospector square Homeowners Association, the following improvements will be made and assessments levied only against property owners in the Prospector Square Subdivision Planned Unit Development. (Which does not include Lots 41 and 42, 44, 45 and 46 of the Prospector Square Subdivision.)

Curb and Gutter along Highway 248 between Bonanza Drive and Sidewinder Drive. Estimated Cost: \$16,860.

Landscape and Install Irrigation System on Common Area at Bonanza Drive and Prospector Drive. Estimated Cost: \$3,700.

Landscape and Install Irrigation System on Common Area along Sidewinder Drive. Estimated Cost: \$3,700.

The following improvements are to the common area known as the walking mall in the Prospector Square Planned Unit Development:

Parking strips adjacent to public parking lots located at Prospector Drive, Sidewinder Drive and Bonanza Drive landscaped and improvements to said parking lots and beautifying parking areas and enclosures of dumpsters located on parking lots. Estimated Cost: \$78,755.00.

Beautifying streets and sidewalks by enclosing utility boxes. Estimated Cost: \$36,915.00.

To improve and beautify streets and sidewalks by providing signage. Estimated Cost: \$73,830.00.

Total cost for improvements in Phase Two, Prospector Square as estimated by the City engineer is \$560,000.00. Property owners shall bear the entire \$560,000.00.

Assessments shall be levied according to square footage owned by property owners of the Prospector Square Subdivision as recorded in the records of the Summit County Recorders Office, except for Lots 41, 42, 44, 45 and 46, which are excepted from Phase Two improvements. Total cost for Phases One and Two is estimated at \$1,310,000.00.

A Public Hearing to hear and consider such protests as may have been made to said improvements on the formation of the Prospector Special Improvement District will be held Thursday, April 4, 1985 at 5:00 p.m. in the Park City Municipal Building located at 445 Marsac Avenue, Park City, Utah. Protests to either Phase One or Phase Two, or any improvement(s) proposed shall be made in writing to the Park City Municipal Corporation, Recorders Office, 445 Marsac Avenue, P.O. Box 1480, Park City, Utah 84060. Written protests must be received by the City Recorder by April 4th, 1985 before or during the Public Hearing on the proposed Special Improvement District. Written protests must be signed by the owner of the property affected or benefitted describing the same by address or legal description.
