EASEMENT FOR RIGHT OF WAY.

This Deed made this 20th day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and Seventeen, between the Layton Sugar Company, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Utah, party of the first part, and THE DENVER AND RIO GRANDE RAILROAD COMPANY, a consolidated corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Colorado, and of the State of Utah, and the OREGON SHORT LINE RAILROAD COMPANY, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the State of Utah, parties of the second part: Witnesseth, That,

The said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable considerations not exceeding the sum of Ninety Eighty Dollars, (\$98.00) to the said party of the first part in hand paid by the said parties of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged, has granted and by these presents does grant unto the said parties of the second part, their successors and assigns forever, the right privilege and easement to maintain and operate a certain railroad track as now existing:

Beginning at a point about 425 feet east and about 15 feet south from the Quarter Section corner between Section 19 and 20, Township 4 North, Range 1 West, Salt Lake Meridian; thence extending westerly about 1400 feet, thence on a curve to the right for a distance of about 600 feet, thence northwesterly about 500 feet to a point 32 feet northeasterly from center line of The Denver and Rio Grande Railroad Company's main track and about 700 feet north from the east and west center line of said Section 19, said track forming a connection between the railroad lines of The Oregon Short Lien Railroad Company, and The Denver and Rio Grande Railroad Company.
