

3495 U.S. to Caleb Parry.

The United States of America:

To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting:

Homestead Certificate No. 2497

Application 4784 } Whereas there has been deposited in the
General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register
of the Land office at Salt Lake City Utah Territory, whereby it appears
that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To
secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the
acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Caleb Parry has been estab-
lished and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the

Lots numbered two and three, the South East quarter of the
North West quarter, and the North East quarter of the South West
quarter of Section four in Township four North of Range one West
of Salt Lake Meridian in Utah Territory, containing One hun-
dred and fifty eight acres and twenty one hundredths of an acre
according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, re-
turned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the Uni-
ted States unto the said Caleb Parry the tract of Land above
described:

To Have and to Hold the said tract of Land, with the ap-
plications thereof, unto the said Caleb Parry and to his heirs
and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights
for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and
rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such
water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the
local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject
to the right of the proprietor of a vein or bed to extract and
remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or
intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

In Testimony Whereof I, Chester A. Arthur, President
of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be
made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be
affixed.

the United States the one hundred and eighth.
