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# DECLARATION OF COVENANTS CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS OF MESA PALMS TOWNHOMES

THIS IS A DECLARATION of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions which establishes a planned unit development known as Mesa Palms Townhomes

#### RECITALS

Declarant is the owner of certain real property (the "properties") in St. George, Washington County, (Utah, which is more particularly described below

Declarant will convey the propedies subject to certain protective covenants, conditions, reservations, assessments, charges and liens as hereinafter set forth

It is the desire and intention of Declarant to construct townhomes and sell and convey the same to vanous purchasers and to convey common area to an Association to which the townhome owners will be members

#### DECLARATION

Declarant hereby declares that all of the properties described below shall be held, sold, conveyed and occupied subject to the following covenants, conditions, restrictions, easements, assessments, charges and liens and to the Map recorded concurrently. This is for the purpose of protecting the value and desirability of the properties. This Declaration and the Map shall be constitued as covenants of equipped servitude, shall run with the properties and be binding on all parties having any right, title or integers in the properties or any pair thereof their heirs, successors and assigns, and shall inure to the benefit of each owner thereof

The Properties are located in St. George, Washington County, stah, and are described as

# ARTICLE I -- DEFINITIONS

The following definitions control in this Declaration These terms, though defined, are generally not capitalized in the Declaration

- Section 1 <u>Declaration</u> means this instrument, and any amendments
- Section 2 <u>Plat or Map means</u> the subdivision plat recorded herewith entitled Mesa Palms Homes—Phase I," consisting of the sheet, prepared and certified by Lloyd Ried Pope, a Utah Registered Land Surveyor" or any replacements thereof, or additions thereto
- Section 3 Property or Properties means that certain real property hereinbefore described, and such additions thereto as may hereafter be subjected to this Declaration
- Section 4 Common Area means that portion of property owned by the Association, shown on the plat as dedicated to the common use and enjoyment of the owners
- Section 5 Limited Common Area means that portion of property owned by the Association, shown on the plat as dedicated to the exclusive use and enjoyment of the owner of the lot to which such limited common area is adjacent and/or appurtenant Limited Common Area) is subject to rights of the Association set forth in this Declaration
- Section 6 Lot 15(6) lot is owned in fee simple by the owner. However, area within the surveyed lot boundaries but duside the originally constructed to whome walls shall be treated as limited common area for use purposes, and as exterior area for maintenance purposes. - Section 7 Townstone means a single family dwelling with or without walls or roofs in common with other single family dwelling lots "Townshome" includes fee title to the real property lyill directly beneath the single family dwelling within lot boundary lines.
- Section 8 Owner means the entity, person, or group of persons owning fee simple title to any lot which is within the properties. Regardless of the number of parties participating in ownership of each lot, the group of those parties shall be treated as one "owner"
- Association means Mess Palms Homeowners Association is successors and
- Section 10 Member means every person or entity who holds membership in the Association Every Member is an owner, and every owner is a member
  - Section 11 Trustees means the governing body of the Association
- Section 12 Declarant means Clear Creek Development L.C. and the Declarant's heirs successors and assigns
- Section 13 Mortgage includes "deed of trust" and mortgagee includes "trust deed beneficiary."

#### ARTICLE II - PROPERTY RIGHTS

Section 1 <u>Title to the Common Area</u> The Declarant will convey fee simple title to the common area and limited common area to the Association, free and clear of all encumbrances and liens, prior to the conveyance of the high lot, but subject to this Declaration and easements and rights of way of record in accepting the dear, the Association will covenant to will all the terms of this Declaration for maintain the common area in good repair and condition at all times and to operate the common area at its own expense in accordance with high standards

- Section 2 Owners' Easements of Enjoyment Every owner has a right and easement of use and enjoyment in and to the common area This easement is appurtenant to and passes with the title to every lot subject to
  - The right of the Association ocharge reasonable admission, use service and other fees for the use of any service or recreational storage, or parking facility situated upon the common area. No fees shall be charged for parking specifically designated on the plat as appurtenant to a jot
  - (b) The right of the Association to limit the number of goests of members using the common area.
  - (c) The right of the Association to suspend the volunt rights and/or common utility service of a member for any period during which any assessment or portion thereof against his lot remains unpaid, and for a period of not to exceed sixty (60) days for any infraction of its published rules and regulations
  - (d) The right of the Association to enter into agreements or leases which provide for use of the common areas and facilities by a similar Association in consideration for use of the common areas and facilities of the other Association, or for cash consideration,
  - The right of the Association with the approval of sixty seven percett 67%) of each class of owners, to sell, exchanges hypothecate, alienate, mortgage encumber, dedicate, release or transfer all or part of the common area to any private individual, corporate entity, public agency, authority, or utility

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- The right of the Association to grant easements for public utilities or other public purposes consistent with the intended use of the common area by the Association
- The right of the Association to take such steps as are reasonably necessary or desirable to protect the common area against foreclosure
- The terms and conditions of this Declaration (h)
- The right of the Association, through its Trustees to adopt rules and regulations concerning use of the common area
- The provisions of Article X herein (i)

Limited Common Area A lot owner is entitled to the exclusive use of the limited Section 3 common area adjacent and appurtenant thereto, if any, and to exclusive use of the parking area, if any, designated with his lot number on the plat. The Association, through its Trustees, may adopt rules and regulations concerning use of the limited common area. Limited common area is subject to the rights of the Association set forth in this Declaration of

> Delegation of Use An owner is deemed to delegate his right of enjoyment to the Section 4 common area and facilities to the members of his family, his tenants, or contract purchasers who reside on the property. No one who is noninesident shall have any such delegable right of enjoyment

Rules. The Board of Trustees shall have the authority to promulgate rules and regulations for the governance of the Properties, and persons within the Properties These rules of the Association shall be compiled and copies shall be made available for inspection and copying by the

Combination of Lots In the event two or more adjacent lots are held in identical Section 6 ownership, the lots may be combined for use and construction purposes. The common or limited common areas which are between the private ownership areas in each of the adjacent lots may be occupted for construction of a single townhome, the owner having an easement for this purpose under, access and over such common and limited common areas For example, if lots and 8 of the original plat were owned by the same owner, and the owner desired to construct a single townhome, the townhome gould occupy the area between lots 7 and 8 (east of lot 8 and west of lot 7) which is designated on the plat as common area. The owner would be required to respect the common and limited common areas in the other non adjacent, boundanes of the lots

In the event of such townhome construction across common or limited common areas between adjacent lots all easement and rights of the Association, its metabers and third parties, such as utilities in such area which had been exercised prior to construction of the townhome would remain in place, in perpetuity However, all easement and other rights which had not been used prior to construction of the townhome could not thereafter be exercised

#### ARTICLE III -- MEMBERSHIP AND VOTING RIGHTS

Membership Every owner is a member of the Association The term "owner" Section 1 includes contract purchasers but does morniclude persons who hold an unterest merely as security for the performance of an obligation unless and until title is acquired by foreclosure or similar proceedings Membership is appurtenant to and may not be separated from to ownership. Membership in the Association automatically transfers upon transfer of title by the record owner to another person or entity

Voling Rights The Association has two classes of voting membership Section 2

Class A members are all members with the exception of the Declarant, as defined CLASS A in the Declaration, Class A members are entitled to one voice for each lot owned. A vote cast at any association meeting by any of such co owners, whether in person or by proxy, is conclusively presumed to be the vote attributable to the lot concerned unless written objection is made prior to that meeting, or verbal objection is made at that meeting, by another co owner of the same lot In the event an expection is made, the vote involved shall not be counted for any purpose except to determine whether a grorum exists

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CLASS B The Class B member is the Declarant The Class B member is entitled to three (3) votes for each Lot owned The Class B membership will cease and be converted to Class A membership on the happening of one of the following events, whichever occurs earlier

(a) the expiration of seven (7) years from the first lot conveyance to a purchaser; or

(b) the surrender of Class B membership status by the express written action of the Declarant In the case of expansion (as provided under the Declaration) which occurs while the Declarant has Class B membership the Declarant's memberships appurtenant to the lots in the expansion area shall be Class B memberships

# ARTICLE IV - FINANCES AND OPERATIONS

Creation of the Nen and Personal Obligation of Assessments The Declarant and Section 1 each subsequent owner of any lotals acceptance of a deed therefor, whether or not it shall be so expressed in any such deed or other conveyance, covenants and agrees to pay to the Association (1) annual assessments or charges (2) special assessments for capital improvements, such assessments to be fixed, established, and collected from time to time as hereinatter provided, (3) any other amount of assessment levied or charged by the Association or Board of Thistees pursuant to this Declaration, and (4) interest, costs of collection and a reasonable attorney's (e.g. as hereinafter provided All such amounts shall be a charge on the land and shall be a continuing lien upon the property against which each such assessment or amount is charged. Such assessments and other amounts shall be the personal obligation. of the person who was the owner of such property at the time when the assessment fell due Successorsin title shall not be personally liable for assessments delinquent at the time they took title unless that obligation expressly assumed by them

Purpose of Assessments The assessments levied by the Association shall be used (a) for the purpose of promoting the recreation, health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the properties and (b) for the improvement and maintenance of properties, segmes, and facilities devoted to This purpose The assessments must provide for but are not limited to, the payment of taxes on Association property and insuface maintained by the Association the payment of the cost of repairing. replacing, maintaining and constructing or acquiring additions to the common and limited common areas. the payment of administrative expenses of the Association insurance deductible amounts the establishment of a reserve account for repair, maintenance and replacement of those common and limited common areas which hast be replaced on a penodic basis and other amounts required by this Declaration or that the Trustees shall determine to be necessary to meet the primary purposes of the Association The assessments may provide at the discretion of the Trustees for the payment of other charges including without limitation, maintenance, management, utility, cable television trash collection, sewer and water charges

Section 3 Maximum Annual Assessment Until January 1 following recording of this Declaration, the maximum annual assessment shall be One Thousand Five Aundred Dollars (\$1,500,00) per lot. This amount shall be the basis of calculation for future maximum annual assessments

From and after the date referred to above the maximum annual assessment shall be increased each year by five percent (5%) above the maximum assessment for the previous year without a vote of the membership

The Association may change the basis and maximum of the assessments fixed by this (b) Section prospectively for any annual period provided that any such change shall have the assent of sixty seven percent (67%) of the votes of each class of members, voting in person or by proxy, at a meeting duly called for this purpose

Special Assessments for Capital Improvements In addition to the annual assessments, the Association may levy in any assessment year a special assessment applicable to that year onthis Special assessments may only be levied to defray, in whole or in part, the cost of any constitution, reconstruction, repair or replacement of common or limited common area structures, fixtures and personal property related thereto. Special assessments must have the assent of sixty seven percent (67%) of the votes of each class of the members authorized to vote, in person or by proxy, at a meeting duly called for this purpose

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Moltheigh Coley Section 5 Additional Assessments in addition to the annual assessments and special assessments for capital improprients authorized herein, the Assessments all levy such additional assessments as may be necessary from time to time for the purpose of repairing and restoring the damage or disruption resulting to streets or other common or timited common areas from the activities of the subject of St. George in maintaining repairing or replacing the City's vitility lines and facilities thereoff it is acknowledged that the ownership of said utility lines, underground or otherwise is in the City in the control of the common or individual units, and that they are installed and shall be maintained to City specifications

Section 6 Notice and Quorum for Any Action Authorized Under Sections 3, 4 and 5 Written notice of any meeting of members called for the purpose of taking any action authorized under Sections 3, 4 or 5 shall be sent to all members at least thirty (30) days in advance of sain meeting. At the first meeting called the presence at the meeting of members, or of proxies, entitled to cast sixty percent (603) of all the votes of each class of membership shall constitute a quorum if the quorum requirement is not meeting, another meeting may be called, on at least thirty (30) days advance written notice, and the required quorum at any such subsequent meeting shall be one half of the required quorum at the preceding meeting. No such subsequent meeting shall be held more than sixty (60) days following the preceding meeting.

Section 7

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Annual, special and additional assessments may be collected on a monthly or quarterly basis as the Fosters determine

Section 8 Date of Commencement of Annual Assessments. Due Dates The annual assessment provided for herein shall commence to accrue on the tirst day of the month following conveyance of the common area. The first annual assessment shall be adjusted according to the number of months remaining in the allendar year. In the absence of a determination by the Trustees as to the amount of said assessment the first annual assessment shall be an amount equal to 90% of the maximum annual assessment provided above

At least thirty(30) days prior to the commencement of each new assessment period, the Trustees shall send or cause to be sent a written notice of the angual assessment to each owner subject thereto. This notice shall not be a pre requisite to validity of the assessment.

The assessment due dates shall be established by the Trustees. The Trustees may provide for the payment of annual and special assessments in equal installments throughout the assessment year.

The Trustees shall prepare a roster of the properties and the assessments applicable thereto at the same time that it shall fix the amount of the annual assessment, which coster shall be kept by the Treasurer of the Association who shall record payments of assessments and shall allow inspection of the roster by any member at reasonable times

The Association shall, upon demand and for a reasonable charge, furnish a certificate signed by an officer of the Association setting forth whether the assessment on a specified lot has been paid. Such certificates, when properly issued shall be conclusive evidence of the payment of any assessment of fractional part thereof which therein shown to have been paid.

Section 9 Section 9 Assessment - Remedies of the Assessment Any assessment or installment thereof not paid within thity (30) days after the due date thereof shall be delinquent and shall bear interest from the due date at the rate of eighteen percent (18%) per annum (or such lesser rate as the Trustees shall determine appropriate) until paid in addition, the Trustees may assess a late fee for each delinquent installment which shall not exceed ten per cent (10%) of the installment

The Trustees may in the name of the Association (a) bring an action at law against the owner personally obligated to pay any such delinquent assessment without waiving the ten of assessment, or (b) may foreclose the tien against the property in accordance with the laws of the State of Utah applicable to

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the exercise of powers of sale in deeds of trust or to the foreclosure of mortgages or in any other manner permitted by law and/or (c) may restrict, limit, or totally terminate any ocall services performed by the Association in behalf of the deligiouent member

Association in behalf of the delarquent member

There shall be added to the amount of any delinquent assessment the costs and expenses of any action sale or foreclosure and a reasonable attorney's fee, together with an account for the reasonable rental for the lot from time to time of commencement of the foreclosure. The Association shall be entitled to the appointment of a receiver to collect the rental income or the reasonable rental without regard to the value of the other security.

A power of sale is hereby conferred upon the Association which it may exercise. Under the power of sale the lot of an owner may be sold in the manner provided by Utah law pertaining to deeds of trust as if said Association were beneficiary under a deed of trust. The Association may designate any person or entity qualified by law to serve as Trustee for purposes of power of sale foreclosure.

Mo owner may waive or otherwise escape liability for the assessments provided for herein by non use the common area or by abandomment of his lot

Section 10 Subordination of the Lien to Mortgages. The lien of the assessments provided for herein shall be subordinate to the lien of any first mortgage held by an institutional lender if the mortgage was recorded prior to the date the assessment became due Sale or transfer of any lot shall not affect the assessment lien. However, the sale or transfer of any lot pursuant of oreclosure of a first mortgage or any proceeding in lieu thereof, shall extinguish the assessment lien be to payments which became due prior to such sale or transfer, however, shall relieve a lot or owner from personal liability for assessments coming the after he takes title or from the lien of such later assessments

Section 11 Books, Records and Audit The Association shall maintain current copies of the Declaration, Articles, Bylaws Rules and other similar documents, as well as its own books, records and financial statements which shall all be available for inspection by lot owners and discurers as well as by holders, incurers and guarantors of first mortgages during normal business hours upon reasonable notice Charges shall be made for copying resembling or extracting from such documents. A lot owner or fiolder, insurer or guarantor of a first mortgage may obtain an audit of Association records at its own expense so long as the results of the audit are provided to the Association.

# ARTICLE V -- INSURANCE

Section 1 Casually Insurance on Insurable Common Area. The Trustees shall keep all insurable improvements and fixtures of the common area insured against loss or damage by fire for the full insurance replacement cost thereof, and may obtain insurance against such other hazards and casualties as the Association may deem desirable. The Association may also insure any other property whether real or personal, owned by the Association, against loss or damage by fire and such other hazards as the Association may deem desirable with the Association as the owner and beneficiary of such insurance. The insurance coverage with respect to the common area shall be written in the name of, and the proceeds thereof shall be payable to. The Association Insurance proceeds shall be used by the Association for the repair or replacement of the property for which the insurance was carried. Premiums for all insurance carried by the Association are common expenses which shall be included in the regular annual assessments made by the Association.

In addition to casually insurance on the Common Area, the Trustees may elect to obtain and continue in effect, on behalf of all owners adequate blanket casually and fire insurance in such form as the Trustees deem appropriate in an amount equal to the full replacement value, without deduction or depreciation or coinsurance, of all of the Townhomes including the structural portions and inviting thereof insurance operations are such blanket insurance coverage and any other insurance premiums paid by the Association shall be a common expense of the Association to be included in the regular annual assessments as levied by the Association. The insurance coverage with respect to the Townhomes shall be written in the name of, and the proceeds thereof shall be payable to the Association as trustee/or the owners.

Replacement or Repetr of Property. In the event of carriage to or destruction of any part of the common area improvements, the Association shall repair or replace the same from the insurance proceeds available. If such insurance proceeds are insufficient to cover the costs of repair or

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repracement of the property damaged or destroyed the Association that make a reconstruction assessment against all lot owners to cover the additional cost of repair or replacement not covered by the insurance proceeds, in addition to any other common assessments made against such tot owner

In the event that the Association is maintaining blanket essually and fire insurance on the Townhomes the Association stall repair or replace the same to the extent of the insurance proceeds. available

In the event of damage or destruction by fire or other pasualty to any portion of the development covered by insurance withen in the name of the Association the Trustees are empowered to and shall represent the members in any proceedings, negotiations, settlements or agreements. The Association is appointed attorney in fact of each owner for this purpose

- Liability Insurance The Trustees shall obtain a comprehensive policy of public liability insurance covering all of the common and limited common property for at least \$1,000,000 00 per occurrence for personal or bodily injury and property damage that results from the operation, maintenance or use of the common areas. Liability insurance policies obtained by the association shall contain a severability of interest: clause or endosement which shall preclude the (issuer from denying the claim of an owner because of negligent acts of the Association or other owners
- Fideint insurance The Trustees may elect to obtain fidelity coverage against than an analysis of the owners which is the first each of the owners than an analysis of the owners of the dishonest acts on the part of managers Trustees officers employees volunteers, management agents or others responsible for mandling funds held and collected to the benefit of the owners or members in procuring fidelity insurance the Trustees shall seek a policy which shall (1) name the Association as obligee or beneficiary, plus (2) be written in an amount not less than the sum of (i) three months operating expenses and (ii) the maximum reserves of the Association which may be on deposit at any time, and (3) contain waivers of any defense based on the exclusion of persons who serve without compensation from any definition of 'employee'
- Annual review of Policies All insurance policies shall be reviewed at least annually Section 5 by the Trustees in order to ascertain whether the coverage contained in the policies is sufficient to make any necessary repairs or replacements of the property which may be damages or destroyed

# ARTICLE VI -- ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

No structure, building, fence, wall or addition, extension or expansion of any of the foregoing shall be commenced erected or maintained upon the properties nor shall any extenor addition or change or alteration to any fot or townhome be made until the plans and specifications showing the nature, kind, shape, height, materials, colors and location of the same shall have been submitted to and approved in writing as to harmony of external design and location in relation to surrounding structures and topography by the Trustees or, if such a committee is an existence, by an Architectural Control Committee composed of three (3) or more representatives appeared by the Trustees In the event said Trustees, or their design and location within thirty (30) days after said plans and specifications have been submitted to it, approval will not be required and compliance with this article will be deemed to have been made

Notwithstanding the levelong without the prior written approval of at least sixty seven percent (67%) of the owners, neither the Association nor the Architectural Control Committee shall have the power, by act or omission to change waive or abandon any oran, scheme or regulations pertaining the architectural design of the exterior appearance or maintenance of townhomes and lots, and the maintenance of the common and limited common areas including walls fences, driveways, lawns and plantings

The Declarant shall not be required to comply with the provisions of this paragraph in the initial construction of the properties

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# ARTICLE VII - EXTERIOR MAINTENANCE

- Section 1 Exterior Maintenance by Owner Each owner shall be responsible for maintenance to the exterior of the townhome owned. The Trustees shall, however in the default of the owner to perform maintenance which is the owner's responsibility, and after a two thirds (2/3) vote, and after ten days written notice which notice shall not be required in the event of emergency or threat to life, health, property or safety); provide exterior maintenance upon each townhome and lot, and the limited common area adjacent and appurtenant thereto. The cost of such maintenance shall be assessed against the lot or townhome.
- Section 2 Exterior Maintenance by Association The Association shall be responsible for maintenance upon the common area, the limited common area, and the area of any locularide the walls of the townhome which is of the same character as surrounding common or limited common area. The Association shall maintain all fandscaping The cost of such maintenance shall be a common expense
- Section 3 Access at Reasonable Hours For the purpose solely of performing the maintenance required by this article, the Association, through its duly authorized agents or employees, shall have the right, after reasonable notice to the owner, to entergine any lot or limited common area at reasonable hours
- Section 4 <u>Alteration of Certain Maintenance Duties by Rule</u> The duty of maintenance for the area of a lot outside the walls of the townhome, and the limited common areas adjacent and appurtenant to the townhomes may be altered by Rule of the Association

#### ARTICLE USE RESTRICTIONS

- Section 1 Construction, Business and Sales Notwithstanding any provisions to the contrary berein contained, it shall be expressly permissible for Declarant to marriain such facilities and conduct such activities as in the sole opinion of Declarant may be reasonably required convenient or incidental to the construction and sale of sites during the period of construction and sale of sites during the period of construction and sale of said lots and upon such portion of the premises as Declarant deems necessary including but not limited to a business office, storage areas, construction and signs, model units and sales offices. As part of the overall program of development of the properties into a residential community and to encourage the marketing thereof, the Declarant shall have the right of use of the common area and facilities thereon, including any community buildings, without charge during the sales and construction period to aid in its marketing activities
- Section 2 General Use Restrictions. All of the properties which are subject to this declaration are hereby restricted to residential dwellings, and buildings in connection therewith including but not limited to community buildings on the common property. All buildings or structures shall be removed from other locations to the properties. After the unital construction on a lot, no subsequent building or structure dissimilar to that initially construction shall be built on that lot. No building or structure of a temporary character, trailer basement, tent camper, shack, garage, barn or other building shall be placed or used on any lot at any time.
- Section 3 Signs. Commercial Activity Except for one "For Rent" or For Sale" sign of any more than two (2) section feet, no advertising signs, billboards objects of unsightly appearance; or nuisances shall be eredded, placed, or permitted to remain on any lot or any portion of the properties. No commercial activities of any kind whatever shall be conducted in any building or on any portion of the properties. The foregoing restrictions shall not apply to the commercial activities, signs and billboards, if any, of the Declarant or its agents during the construction and sales period or by the Association in furtherance of its powers and purposes set forth hereinafter and in its Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws and Rules and Regulations, as the same may be anothed from time to time.

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Section 4 Quiet Enjoyment No noxious or offensive activity shall be carried on upon any part of the properties nor shall anything be done thereon which may be or may become an annoyance or nuisance to the neighborhood or which shall in any way interfered with the quiet enjoyment of each of this owners or which shall in any way increase the rate of insurance.

Section 5
Animals
No animals, livestock or pourity of any kind shall be raised the cor kept on any of said lots, except that dogs, cats or other household pets, two or less in total number, may be kept provided that they are not kept bred or maintained for any commercial purpose. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no animals or fowl may be kept on the property which result in an annoyance or are obnoxious, by noise smell or otherwise to lot owners. All pets must be kept in the lots or on a leash when in the common areas. This provision may be made more restrictive by Rule of the Association.

Section 6

<u>Use of Common Area</u>

Section 7 Parking No motor vehicle which is inoperable shall be allowed within the Properties and any motor vehicle which remains parked over 72 hours shall be subject to removal by the Association, at the owner's expense.
