THAT WHEREAS, the undersigned being the owners of the following described real property located in Salt Lake County, State of Utah:

Lots 201 through 218 inclusive, SILVER MEADOWS PLAT B, according to the plat thereof, as recorded in the office of the County Recorder of said County.

do hereby establish the nature of the and enjoyment of all lots, in said subdivision and do declare that 11 conveyance of said lots shall be made subject to the following conditions, restrictions and atipulations:

PART B. RESIDENTIAL AREA COVENANTS

- 1. Land Use and Building Type. No lot shall be used except for residential purposes. No building shall be erected, altered, placed or permitted to remain on any lot other than one detached single-family dwelling not to exceed two stories in height and a private garage and carport for not more than three vehicles. All construction to be of new materials. Garage or carport not required.
- 2. Architectural Control. No building shall be erected, placed, or altered on any lot until the construction plans and specifications and a plan showing the location of the structure have been approved by the Architectural Control Committee as to quality of workmanship and materials, narmonyoī external design with existing structures, and as to location with respect to topography and finish grade elevation. No fence or wall shall be erected, placed or altered on any any lot nearer to any street than the minium building setback line unless similarly approved. Approval shall be as provided in Part C.
- 3. Dwelling Cost. Quality and Size. No dwelling shall be permitted on any lot at a cost of less that \$45,000.00 including lot, based upon cost levels prevailing on the date these covenants are recorded, it being the intention and purpose of the covenants to assure that all dwellings shall be of quality of workmanship and materials substantially the same or better that that which can be produced on the date these covenants are recorded at the minium cost stated herein for the minium permitted dwelling size. The main floor of the main structure, exclusive of one-story open porches and garages, shall be not less than 800 square feet for ramblers, split entries and tri-levels (main floor of the main structure defined as living room, and/or family room, kitchen/dining, bedrooms and bathrooms). The main floor of two-story structures shall be no less that 450 sq. ft.
- Building Cocation.

 (a) No building shall be located on any lot nearer to the front lot line or nearer to the side street line than the minimum building setback lines shown on the recorded plat. In any event no building shall be located on any lot nearer than 25 feet to the front lot line, or nearer than 20 feet to any side street line for corner lots.
 - (b) No dwelling shall be located nearer than five feet to any interior lot line, except that a one-foot minimum side yard shall be permitted for a garage or other permitted accessory building located 25 feet or more from the minium from building setback line. No main building shall be located on any interior lot nearer that 15 feet to the rear lot line. Detached garages or other permitted accessory buildings may a located within one foot of the rear lot line, so long as such building and entropy encroach upon any easements.

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- 5. Lot Area and Width. No dwelling shall be erected or placed on any lot having a width of less than 70 feet at the minimum building setback line nor shall any dwelling be erected or placed on any lot having an area of less than 7,000 square feet, except that a dwelling may be erected or placed on all corner and cul-de-sac lots as shown on the recorded plat, provided that the above front and side yard clearance are maintained.
- 6. Easement. Easements for installation and maintenance of utilities and drainage facilities are reserved as shown on the recorded plat. Within these easements no structure, planting or other material shall be placed or permitted to remain which may damage or interfere with the installation and maintenance of utilities, or which may change the direction of the flow of drainage channels in the easements, or which obstruct or retard the flow of water through drainage channels in the easements. The easement area of each lot and all improvements in it shall be maintained continuously by the owner of the lot, except for those improvements for which a public authority or utility company is responsible.
- 7. Nuisances. No Noxious or offensive activity shall be carried on upon any lot, nor shall anything be done thereon which may be or may become an annoyance or nuisance to the neighborhood. No clothes drying or storage of any articles which are unsightly in the opinion of the Architectural Control Committee will be permitted in carports, unless in enclosed areas built and designed for such purpose. No automobiles, trailers, boats, or other vehicles are to be stored on streets or front side lots unless they are in running condition, properly licensed and are being regularly used.

- 8. Temporary Structures. No structure of a temporary character trailer, basement, tent, shack, garage, barn or other outbuildings shall be used on any lot at any time as a residence either temporarily or permanently.
- 9. Signs. No sign of any kind shall be displayed to the public view on any lot except one professional sign of not more than one square foot, one sign of not more than five square feet advertising the property for sale or rent, or signs used by a builder to advertise the property during the construction and sales period.
- 10. Livestock and Poultry. No animals, livestock or poultry of any kind shall be raised, bred or kept on any lot, except that dogs, cats or other household pets may be kept provided that they are not kept, bred, or maintained for any commercial purpose and are restricted to the owner's premises or on leash under a handler's control.
- 11. Garbage and Refuse Disposal. No lot shall be used or maintained as a dumping ground for rubbish. Trash, garbage or other waste shall not be kept except in sanitary containers. All incinerators or other equipment for the storage or disposal of such material shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition. Each lot and its abutting street are to be kept free of trash, weeds and other refuse by the lot owner. No unsightly materials or other objects are to be stored on any lot in view of the general public.
- 12. Sight Distance at Intersection No fence, wall hedge or short planting which obstructs sight lines at elevation between two and six feat above the roadways shall be placed or permitted to remain on any corner late of the

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triangular area formed by the street property lines and a line connecting them at points 25 feet from the intersection of the street lines, or in case of a rounded property corner from the intersection of the street property lines extended. The same sight-line limitations shall apply on any lot within 10 feet from the intersection of a street property line with the edge of a driveway or alley pavement. No tree shall be permitted to remain within such distance of such intersections unless the foliage line is maintained at sufficient height to prevent obstruction of such sight lines.

- 13. Oil and Mining Operations. No oil-drillings, oil development operations, oil refining, quarrying or mining operations of any kind shall be permitted upon or in any lot, now shall oil wells, tanks, mineral excavations or shafts be permitted upon or in any lot. No derrick or other structure designed for use in boring for oil or natural gas shall be erected, maintained or permitted upon any lot.
- 14. Landscaping. Landscaping shall be installed in front yards between the front line of the house and the sidewalk on the entire width of the lot excluding the driveway. On corner lots landscaping shall be installed in all areas between the sidewalk and the sidefine of the house between the front property line and the rear property line which are visible from the public right-of-way. This coverant and restriction shall not be changed or amended but shall run with the land permanently and perpetually.

Landscaping shall include at least (1) tree and a combination of lawn, shrubs or ground cover. Cround cover may include vegetative vines, low spreading shrubs, or annual or perennial flowering or foliage plants. Ground cover may also include mineral or non-living organic permeable material in not more than 50% of the net landscape area. Mineral ground cover may include such materials as rocks, boulders, gravel or brick over sand. Species, size and placement of landscaping elements shall be determined by the homeowner. This covenent and restriction shall not be changed or amended but shall run with the land permanently and perpetually.

15. Slope and Drainage Control, No structure, planting or other material shall be placed or permitted to remain or other activities undertaken which may damage or interfere with established slope ratios, crease erosion or sliding problems, or which may change the direction of flow of water through drainage channels. The slope control areas of each lot and all improvements in them shall be maintained continuously by the owner of the lot, except for those improvements for which a public authority or utility company is responsible.

PART C. ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

- 1. Membership. A majority of the committee may designate a representative to act for it. In the event of death or resignation of any member of the committee, the remaining members of the committee shall have full authority to select a successor. Neither the member of the committee, nor its designated representative shall be entitled to any compensation for services performed pursuant to this covenant. At any time, the then record owners of a majority of the lots shall have the power through a duly ecorded written instrument to change the membership of the committee or to withdraw from the committee or restore to it any of its powers and duties. The Architectural Control Committee is composed of KEN NICKLE, STEVEN NICKLE, JERRY TAYLOR, STAN SOUTHAM
- 2. Procedure. The Committe's approval or disapproval as required in these covenants shall be in writing. In the event the committee, or its designated representative, fails to approve or disapprove within 30 days after plans and specifications have been submitted to it, or in any event, if no suit to enjoin the construction has been commenced prior to the completion thereof, approval will not be required, and the related covenants shall be deemed to have been fully complied with.

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- 1. Term. The covenants are to run with the land and shall be tinding on all parties and all persons claiming under them for a period of two years from the date these covenants are recorded, after which time said covenants shall be automatically extended for successive periods of ten years unless an instrument signed by a majority of the then owners of the lots has been recorded, agreeing to change said covenants in whole or in part.
- 2. Enforcement. Enforcement shall be by proceedings at law or in equity against any person or persons violating or attempting to violate any covenants either to restrain violation or to recover damages.
- 3. Severability. Invalidation of any one of these covenants by judgement or court order shall in no ways affect any of the other provisions which shall remain in full force and effect.
