RIGHT OF WAY GRANT

FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of Ten & No/100 dollars, to it in hand ^{Paid} the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, The First National Bank of Coalville, Utah, a corporation of the State of Utah does hereby for itself its heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns, grant and release to Mountain Fuel Supply Company its heirs legal representatives, successors and assigns, the right of way to lay, maintain, operate and remove pipe lines, and erect, maintain and operate telegraph or telephone lines, if the same shall be thought necessary by said grante, over and through its lands in Township 3 N. Range 7 E. County of Summit State of Utah, bounded and described as follows Part of the North Half (N¹/₂) of Section thirty-five (35) Township 3 North Range 7 East of the Salt Lake Base and Meridian.

including the waive and release of right of homestead, with the right of ingress and egress to and from the same. The grantor to fully use and enjoy the premises, except for the purpose hereinbefore granted to the said Mountain Fuel Supply Company, who hereby agrees to pay any damages which may arise to crops or fences from the laying, erecting maintaining, operation or removing of said pipe, telegraph and telephone lines said damages, if not mutually agreed upon to be ascertained and determined by three disinterested persons, one thereof to be appointed by the said MOUNTAIN FUEL SUPPLY COMPANY, its heirs, or assigns, one by the said grantor, its successors or assigns, and the third by the two so app- as aforesaid, and the award of such three persons, or any two of them, shall be final and conclusive. Should more than one pipe line be laid under this grant at any time, a like consideration shall be paid for each line so laid in addition to the damages above provided, for.
