Whereas There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May 1862, To secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain, and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Francis A. Brown has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the lots numbered three and four of section two, in township five north, of range two west of Salt Lake Meridian, in Utah Territory, containing eighty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General;

do hereby certify that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto

the said Francis A. Brown the tract of land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Francis A. Brown and to his heirs and assigns forever, subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

A part of Section Seventeen (17) in Township Six (6) North of Range Two (2) West Salt Lake Meridian U. S. Survey.
