Quit-Claim Deed.

Oregon Short Line Railroad Company, a corporation, grantor, of the state of Utah, hereby Quit-Claims to Syracuse Mercantile Company, a corporation, grantees, of Davis County, Utah, for the sum of fifty dollars, the following described tract of land in Davis County, State of Utah, That part of the right of way heretofore used and occupied by the grantor, bounded on the east by the east line of the north west quarter of the south west quarter of section No. one, Township No. four, North Range No. two, West S. L. meridian on the north by an east and west line, distant nine hundred thirty seven (937) feet from the east and west center line of said section measured along the east line of said right of way, and on the southwesterly side by land owned by the grantee herein said tract containing 0.45 acres more or less.

Reserving to the grantor a right of way for its Telegraph line now constructed thereon, together with right of entry by team or otherwise for the repair, maintenance and removal of said line and removal of its track now thereon. Grantor agrees not to alienate said reserved right of way.
